AN ACT Relating to fiscal matters; amending 1999 c 379 ss 112, 758, and 937 (uncodified); amending 2000 2nd sp.s. c 1 ss 1008 and 1013 (uncodified); adding a new section to 1999 c 379 (uncodified); making appropriations; authorizing expenditures for capital improvements; and declaring an emergency.

7 The appropriation in this section is subject to the following 8 conditions and limitations:

- 9 (1) The appropriation in this section is subject to the review and 10 allotment procedures under sections 902 and 903, chapter 379, Laws of 11 1999.
- 12 (2) ((\$2,000,000)) \$4,500,000 of the appropriation in this section 13 is provided for ((design of the interior rehabilitation and exterior 14 preservation of)) earthquake related costs associated with the state legislative building ((consistent with the recommendations of the 15 16 commission on legislative building preservation and renovation)). Funds in this subsection are also provided for planning ((and 17 18 development of)), developing, and securing relocation space for current 19 and future construction projects related to the capitol historic 20 district ((as well as access)) and site improvements ((to the south 21 portico area)).
- 22 (3) The department, in consultation with the legislature, the 23 governor, and the state capitol committee, shall immediately begin 24 planning and initiate an accelerated design/construction schedule for 25 the renovation of the state legislative building as follows:
- 26 <u>(a) No new permanent buildings shall be constructed, and the</u>
 27 <u>department shall follow standards for historic preservation;</u>
- 28 <u>(b) The goal shall be to reoccupy the building in time for the 2004</u>
 29 <u>legislative session;</u>
- 30 (c) The department shall make temporary accommodations for the displacement of legislators and legislative staff. Functionally, the house of representatives shall be accommodated in the John L. O'Brien building and the Pritchard building while the senate shall be accommodated in the Cherberg building and Newhouse building. It is intended that the chambers of the house of representatives, house members and staff, and other legislative functions be located in the
- 37 <u>Pritchard building;</u>

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- 1 (d) The department shall temporarily move the state library to the
- 2 Sunset Life building by June 30, 2001, and, if needed, the department
- 3 shall lease storage facilities in Thurston county for books and other
- 4 library assets;
- 5 <u>(e) The department shall make temporary accommodations for other</u> 6 tenants of the state legislative building as follows:
- 7 <u>(i) The office of the insurance commissioner shall be moved to</u> 8 leased space in Thurston county;
- 9 <u>(ii) The office of the governor shall be moved to the Insurance</u>
 10 building in the space formerly occupied by the insurance commissioner;
- 11 (iii) The office of the code reviser and the lieutenant governor
- 12 shall be moved to a location on the west capitol campus; and
- 13 (iv) The other tenants, including the office of the state
- 14 treasurer, the office of the state auditor, and the office of the
- 15 <u>secretary of state shall be moved to leased space in Thurston county;</u>
- 16 <u>and</u>
- 17 <u>(f) The state legislative building shall be completely vacated by</u>
- 18 September 15, 2001, to make it available for renovation by the
- 19 <u>contractor</u>.
- 20 (4) \$1,000,000 of the appropriation in this section is provided for
- 21 associated studies including:
- (a) A private financing feasibility study;
- 23 (b) An investigation of exterior sandstone attachment; and
- 24 (c) A space use programming study to include:
- 25 (i) A prioritization of uses within the legislative building based
- 26 on functional affiliation with the legislative process and the
- 27 ceremonial functions of state-wide office holders that takes into
- 28 consideration emerging telecommunication capabilities;
- 29 (ii) An analysis of space efficiency and space use related to
- 30 legislative and state-wide ceremonial functions in the following
- 31 buildings: Cherberg, O'Brien, Pritchard, Newhouse, the governor's
- 32 mansion, and insurance;
- 33 (iii) A review of alternative uses and expansion capabilities for
- 34 buildings on the capitol campus; and
- 35 (iv) By November 30, 2000, the department shall submit a report to
- 36 the appropriate committees of the legislature on the recommendations of
