- 1 AN ACT Relating to workers' compensation for multiple chemical
- 2 sensitivity syndrome; adding a new section to chapter 51.08 RCW; and

- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 5 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 1.** A new section is added to chapter 51.08 RCW
- 6 to read as follows:
- 7 "Multiple chemical sensitivity syndrome" means a chronic condition
- 8 with symptoms that affect multiple organ systems and recur reproducibly
- 9 in an individual in response to low levels of exposure to multiple
- 10 unrelated chemicals and improve or resolve when the triggering
- 11 chemicals are removed.
- 12 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 2.** A new section is added to chapter 51.32 RCW
- 13 to read as follows:
- 14 (1) Multiple chemical sensitivity syndrome due to workplace
- 15 exposure to chemicals is an occupational disease compensable under this
- 16 title.
- 17 (2) A worker who has been diagnosed with multiple chemical
- 18 sensitivity syndrome prior to experiencing symptoms of a work-related

- 1 occupational disease due to chemical exposure does not need to prove
- 2 that the occupational disease arises naturally and proximately out of
- 3 employment. The worker need prove only that work-related conditions
- 4 contributed to, aggravated, exacerbated, or accelerated the preexisting
- 5 multiple chemical sensitivity syndrome.
