The interagency committee for outdoor 1 2 recreation shall administer the account for purposes specified in this chapter and shall hold it separate and apart from all other money, 3 accounts of the interagency committee for outdoor 4 funds, and Grants, gifts, or other financial assistance, proceeds 5 recreation. received from public bodies as administrative cost contributions, and 6 7 any moneys made available to the state of Washington by the federal 8 government for outdoor recreation may be deposited into the account. 9 During the 2001-2003 fiscal biennium, the legislature may transfer from the account to the state general fund such amounts as reflect the 10 excess fund balance of the account. 11

12 Sec. 306. RCW 79A.25.200 and 2000 c 11 s 77 are each amended to 13 read as follows:

14 The recreation resource account is created in the state treasury. 15 Moneys in this account are subject to legislative appropriation. The 16 committee shall administer the account in accordance with this chapter 17 and chapter 79A.35 RCW and shall hold it separate and apart from all 18 other money, funds, and accounts of the committee. Moneys received from the marine fuel tax refund account under RCW 79A.25.070 shall be 19 deposited into the account. Grants, gifts, or other financial 20 assistance, proceeds received from public bodies as administrative cost 21 22 contributions, and moneys made available to the state of Washington by 23 the federal government for outdoor recreation may be deposited into the 24 account. During the 2001-2003 fiscal biennium, the legislature may 25 transfer from the account to the state general fund such amounts as reflect the excess fund balance of the account. 26

27 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 307. If any provision of this act or its 28 application to any person or circumstance is held invalid, the 29 remainder of the act or the application of the provision to other 30 persons or circumstances is not affected.

31 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 308.** This act is necessary for the immediate 32 preservation of the public peace, health, or safety, or support of the 33 state government and its existing public institutions, and takes effect 34 immediately.
