PART 2 JOB CREATION AND INFRASTRUCTURE PROGRAM

б NEW SECTION. Sec. 201. The governor and legislature find that the 7 state of Washington is faced with a serious economic downturn following the tragic events of September 11, 2001, and that creating jobs through 8 capital construction will help stabilize and strengthen the state's 9 long-term economy. The dollar amounts specified in this Part 2 are 10 appropriated and authorized to be incurred for capital projects during 11 the period ending June 30, 2003, for the purposes of stimulating the 12 13 state economy through state construction projects. 13 Trust Land Transfer Program (02-2-010)

The state building construction account <u>and the educational capital</u> <u>construction account appropriations</u> in this section ((is)) <u>are</u> subject to the following conditions and limitations:

17 (1) The total appropriation is provided to the department solely to 18 transfer from trust status or enter into thirty-year timber harvest 19 restrictive easements for certain trust lands of state-wide 20 significance deemed appropriate for state park, fish and wildlife 21 habitat, natural area preserve, natural resources conservation area, 22 open space, or recreation purposes.

(2) Property transferred under this section shall be appraised and 23 24 transferred at fair market value. The value of the timber transferred 25 shall be deposited by the department to the common school construction 26 account in the same manner as timber revenues from other common school trust lands. No deduction shall be made for the resource management 27 cost account under RCW 79.64.040. The value of the land transferred 28 29 shall be deposited in the natural resources real property replacement 30 account. These funds shall be expended by the department for the exclusive purpose of acquiring real property of equal value to be 31 managed as common school trust land. 32

(3) Property subject to easement agreements under this section shall be appraised at fair market value both with and without the imposition of the easement. The entire difference in appraised value shall be deposited by the department to the common school construction 1 fund in the same manner as lease revenues from other common school 2 trust lands. No deduction shall be made for the resource management 3 cost account under RCW 79.64.040.

4 (4) All reasonable costs incurred by the department to implement
5 this section are authorized to be paid out of this appropriation.
6 Authorized costs include the actual cost of appraisals, staff time,
7 environmental reviews, surveys, and other similar costs.

8 (5) Intergrant exchanges between common school and other trust 9 lands of equal value may occur if the exchange is in the interest of 10 each trust, as determined by the board of natural resources.

11 (6) Prior to or concurrent with conveyance of these properties, the 12 department, with full cooperation of the receiving agencies, shall 13 execute and record a real property instrument that dedicates the transferred properties to the purposes identified in subsection (1) of 14 15 this section for a minimum period of thirty years. The department of 16 natural resources, in consultation with the receiving state agencies, 17 shall develop policy to address requests to replace transferred properties subject to the recorded property instrument that are no 18 19 longer deemed appropriate for the purposes identified in subsection (1) of this section. 20

(7) The department and receiving agencies shall work in good faith to carry out the intent of this section. However, the department or receiving agencies may remove a property from the transfer list based on new, substantive information, if it is determined that transfer of the property is not in the statewide interest of either the common school trust or the receiving agency.

27 (8) The department shall execute trust land transfers and easements such that ((80 percent of the)) all of the educational capital 28 29 construction account appropriation in this section is deposited in the 30 common school construction fund. To achieve the 80:20 ratio between 31 the educational capital construction account appropriation for timber, and the state building construction account appropriation for land, the 32 33 department may offset transfers of property with low timber-to-land ratios with easements on other properties. 34

(9) On June 30, 2003, the state treasurer shall transfer all remaining uncommitted funds from ((this)) these appropriations to the common school construction fund and the appropriations in this section shall be reduced by an equivalent amount.

NEW SECTION. Sec. 218. Agencies shall expedite the expenditure of 15 appropriations for the job creation and infrastructure program in order 16 17 (1) Maximize additional private employment opportunities to: 18 associated with capital expenditures; (2) expediently renew and repair a wide variety of state facilities and infrastructure; and (3) minimize 19 reappropriations for work under this section to those projects that 20 21 have been encumbered and are substantially underway by June 30, 2003. Agencies shall implement the job creation and infrastructure program 22 23 within the agency's current level of employees.

Sec. 219. No expenditure may be incurred or 8 obligation assumed against job creation and infrastructure program 9 appropriations until the office of financial management has approved 10 the allotment of the funds to be expended.

The office of financial management shall report the following 11 information to the appropriate fiscal committees of the legislature by 12 13 December 1, 2002: (1) A list of projects by agency that are funded for job creation and infrastructure improvement; (2) a status report on 14 15 each project noting percent completion; and (3) an explanation of why any appropriation remains unexpended. Agencies shall make this 16 information available to the office of financial management upon 17 18 request.

The office of financial management shall 20 establish a process to monitor the progress of the projects that 21 received appropriations in the job creation and infrastructure program 22 and may subsequently redirect any unencumbered funds from projects 23 whose timelines are not being met to finance other projects in any 24 other agency.
