## SENATE BILL 6528

## State of Washington 57th Legislature 2002 Regular Session

1 AN ACT Relating to the selection of responsible contractors bidding 2 on public works; and adding a new chapter to Title 39 RCW.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

MEW SECTION. Sec. 1. The purpose of this chapter is to allow all state or local governmental entities that award contracts for publicly funded projects to select contractors by the lowest responsible bidder method.

8 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 2. (1) A state or local governmental entity 9 that awards contracts for publicly funded projects must examine all 10 bids to determine which contractors are the lowest responsible bidders. 11 (2) The governmental entity must make an affirmative determination 12 of responsibility.

13 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 3. In determining lowest responsible bidder, in 14 addition to price, the governmental entity awarding the contract must 15 consider the following elements:

(1) The ability, capacity, and skill of the bidder to perform thecontract or provide the service required;

1 (2) The reputation and experience of the bidder;

2 (3) Whether the bidder has demonstrated the ability to perform the3 contract within the time specified;

4 (4) The quality of performance of previous contracts or services by5 the bidder;

6 (5) The previous and existing compliance by the bidder with laws 7 relating to the contract or services.

8 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 4. Governmental entities may create their own 9 questionnaire, or may use a questionnaire created by the Washington 10 state department of general administration or the superintendent of 11 public instruction to determine compliance with section 3 of this act.

12 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 5. (1) The apparent low bidder must supply the 13 requested information within two business days of the bid opening. 14 Failure to submit the information within the time provided will render 15 the bid nonresponsible. If the information that is provided is false 16 on a material point, then the bid will be deemed nonresponsible.

(2) All information submitted on the questionnaire is subject topublic inspection.

19 NEW SECTION. Sec. 6. If the apparent low bidder is deemed not responsible, the governmental entity shall notify the bidder in 20 21 writing. Within three days of receipt of such notification, the bidder 22 may withdraw its bid or request a hearing. A hearing must be scheduled 23 within three days of a bidder's request. Hearing participants shall include a representative of the jurisdiction awarding the contract and 24 25 a representative of the contractor and may include any interested parties as defined in RCW 39.12.010. A final determination shall be 26 27 issued after reviewing information presented at the hearing. Both the governmental entity and the entity's contracting officer are immune 28 from any suit or litigation brought on behalf of a bidder found not to 29 30 be responsible.

31 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 7. Sections 1 through 6 of this act constitute 32 a new chapter in Title 39 RCW.
