- 1 AN ACT Relating to information required to appear on a prescription
- 2 label; and amending RCW 18.64.246.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 4 **Sec. 1.** RCW 18.64.246 and 1984 c 153 s 13 are each amended to read 5 as follows:
- 6 To every box, bottle, jar, tube or other container of a

prescription which is dispensed there shall be fixed a label bearing

- 8 the name and address of the ((pharmacy wherein the prescription is
- 9 compounded, the corresponding serial number of the prescription, the
- 9 compounded, the corresponding serial number of the prescription, the
- 10 name of the prescriber, his directions, the name of the medicine and
- the strength per unit dose, name of patient, date, the expiration date, and initials of the licensed pharmacist who has compounded the
- 13 prescription, and)) dispensing pharmacy, the prescription number, the
- 14 name of the prescriber, the prescriber's directions, the name and
- 15 strength of the medication, the name of the patient, the date, and the
- 16 expiration date. The security of the cover or cap on every bottle or
- 17 jar shall meet safety standards ((promulgated)) adopted by the state
- 18 board of pharmacy((: PROVIDED, That)). At the ((physician's))
- 19 <u>prescriber's</u> request, the name and ((dosage)) <u>strength</u> of the ((drug))

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medication need not be shown. If the prescription is for a combination 1 2 ((drug)) medication product, the generic names of the ((drugs)) medications combined or the trade name used by the manufacturer or 3 4 distributor for the product shall be noted on the label. identification of the licensed pharmacist responsible for each 5 dispensing of medication must either be recorded in the pharmacy's 6 record system or on the prescription label. This section shall not 7 8 apply to the dispensing of ((medicines)) medications to in-patients in 9 hospitals.

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
