## SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION 8409

State of Washington 57th Legislature 2001 Regular Session

Read first time 01/23/2001. Referred to Committee on State & Local Government.

1 WHEREAS, Since statehood, the lifestyles, culture, and economies of 2 Eastern and Western Washington have been very distinct; and 3 WHEREAS, A similar distinction is also true of Eastern and Western 4 Oregon; and 5 WHEREAS, The similarities between Eastern Washington and Eastern Oregon and Western Washington and Western Oregon are dramatic; and б 7 WHEREAS, Urbanization and rapid growth in the western portions of both states has progressively heightened this divergence of cultural 8 and economic values from that of the eastern portions of the states; 9 10 and 11 WHEREAS, A reconsideration of the state boundary lines of 12 Washington and Oregon in light of these divergences and similarities is in order; 13 14 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, By the Senate of the state of 15 Washington, the House of Representatives concurring, That a select 16 committee on state boundaries be established to study the feasibility 17 of boundary line changes and the process to accomplish such changes; 18 and 19 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the committee consist of ten members:

20 Two from the Washington State House of Representatives, one from each 21 major political caucus, appointed by the Speaker of the House of

Representatives; two from the Washington State Senate, one from each 1 major political caucus, appointed by the President of the Senate; two 2 from the Oregon State House of Representatives, one from each major 3 4 political caucus, appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives; two from the Oregon State Senate, one from each major 5 political caucus, appointed by the President of the Senate; and one 6 member from each state representing the governor and appointed by the 7 governor of each state. The legislative membership from each state 8 9 shall include an equal number of representatives from the western 10 portion of the state and the eastern portion; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the committee report its findings and recommendations to the Washington State Legislature by December 28, 2001; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the committee be jointly staffed by committee staff from each state.
