- 2 AND TO THE PRESIDENT OF THE SENATE AND THE SPEAKER OF THE HOUSE OF
- 3 REPRESENTATIVES, AND TO THE SENATE AND HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE
- 4 UNITED STATES, IN CONGRESS ASSEMBLED:
- 5 We, your Memorialists, the Senate and House of Representatives of
- 6 the State of Washington, in legislative session assembled, respectfully
- 7 represent and petition as follows:
- 8 WHEREAS, A provision in federal law that took effect October 1,
- 9 2000, requires states to gather Social Security Numbers from applicants
- 10 seeking or renewing drivers' licenses as part of the 1997 welfare
- 11 reform act, designed to help recover overdue child support from
- 12 obligated parents; and
- 13 WHEREAS, The state of Michigan has sued the federal government in
- 14 federal court to block this law that forces all states to collect
- 15 Social Security Numbers from tens of millions of motorists, and which
- 16 is an uncalled for invasion of privacy; and
- 17 WHEREAS, Michigan's suit argues that the law violates the United
- 18 States constitutional quarantee against invasion of privacy, represents
- 19 an unfunded federal mandate, and violates the tenth amendment to the
- 20 Constitution by requiring states to administer a federal regulatory

1 WHEREAS, The Washington State Legislature complied with the federal 2 requirements, but directed the department of social and health services 3 to seek a waiver from the federal government, and that waiver was

5 WHEREAS, Noncompliance could cost the state approximately one 6 billion dollars in federal funding; and

WHEREAS, The states already do a great job in collecting support payments, and creating another data base with Social Security Numbers can add to the growing crime of identity theft; and

10 WHEREAS, It is important that all states, whether or not they are currently complying with the federal law requiring states to gather 12 Social Security Numbers from applicants seeking or renewing drivers' 13 licenses, take a stand against the federal government imposing 14 unnecessary and overreaching regulations on the states;

NOW, THEREFORE, Your Memorialists respectfully pray that the United States Congress guarantee the constitutional rights of privacy of American citizens, eliminate unfunded federal mandates, and protect federalism by eliminating the Social Security Number collection requirements.
