- 1 AN ACT Relating to the formula for determining certificated
- 2 instructional staff salaries for state-funded basic education
- 3 certificated instructional staff; amending RCW 28A.150.410 and
- 4 28A.400.200; and providing an effective date.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 6 **Sec. 1.** RCW 28A.150.410 and 1997 c 141 s 1 are each amended to 7 read as follows:
- 8 (1) The legislature shall establish for each school year in the
- 9 appropriations act a state-wide salary allocation schedule, for
- 10 allocation purposes only, to be used to distribute funds for basic
- 11 education certificated instructional staff salaries under RCW
- 12 28A.150.260.
- 13 (2) ((The superintendent of public instruction shall calculate
- 14 salary allocations for state funded basic education certificated
- 15 instructional staff by determining the district average salary for
- 16 basic education and special education instructional staff using the
- 17 salary allocation schedule established pursuant to this section.))
- 18 Salary allocations for state-funded basic education certificated
- 19 instructional staff shall be calculated by the superintendent of public

- 1 <u>instruction</u> by <u>determining</u> the <u>district's</u> average salary for
- 2 <u>certificated instructional staff, using the statewide salary allocation</u>
- 3 schedule and related documents, conditions, and limitations established
- 4 by the omnibus appropriations act.
- 5 (3) Beginning January 1, 1992, no more than ninety college quarter-
- 6 hour credits received by any employee after the baccalaureate degree
- 7 may be used to determine compensation allocations under the state
- 8 salary allocation schedule and LEAP documents referenced in the
- 9 ((biennial)) omnibus appropriations act, or any replacement schedules
- 10 and documents, unless:
- 11 (a) The employee has a masters degree; or
- 12 (b) The credits were used in generating state salary allocations
- 13 before January 1, 1992.
- 14 Sec. 2. RCW 28A.400.200 and 1997 c 141 s 2 are each amended to
- 15 read as follows:
- 16 (1) Every school district board of directors shall fix, alter,
- 17 allow, and order paid salaries and compensation for all district
- 18 employees in conformance with this section.
- 19 (2)(a) Salaries for certificated instructional staff shall not be
- 20 less than the salary provided in the appropriations act in the
- 21 statewide salary allocation schedule for an employee with a
- 22 baccalaureate degree and zero years of service; and
- 23 (b) Salaries for certificated instructional staff with a masters
- 24 degree shall not be less than the salary provided in the appropriations
- 25 act in the statewide salary allocation schedule for an employee with a
- 26 masters degree and zero years of service;
- 27 (3)(a) The actual average salary paid to ((basic education and
- 28 special education)) certificated instructional staff shall not exceed
- 29 the district's average ((basic education and special education
- 30 program)) certificated instructional staff salary used for the state
- 31 basic education allocations for that school year as determined pursuant
- 32 to RCW 28A.150.410.
- 33 (b) Fringe benefit contributions for ((basic education and special
- 34 education)) certificated instructional staff shall be included as
- 35 salary under (a) of this subsection only to the extent that the
- 36 district's actual average benefit contribution exceeds the amount of
- 37 the insurance benefits allocation provided per certificated
- 38 instructional staff unit in the state operating appropriations act in

- effect at the time the compensation is payable. For purposes of this 1 section, fringe benefits shall not include payment for unused leave for 2 illness or injury under RCW 28A.400.210; employer contributions for old 3 4 survivors insurance, workers' compensation, unemployment compensation, and retirement benefits under the Washington state 5 retirement system; or employer contributions for health benefits in 6 7 excess of the insurance benefits allocation provided per certificated 8 instructional staff unit in the state operating appropriations act in effect at the time the compensation is payable. A school district may 9 10 not use state funds to provide employer contributions for such excess health benefits. 11
- (c) Salary and benefits for certificated instructional staff in programs other than basic education ((and special education)) shall be consistent with the salary and benefits paid to certificated instructional staff in the basic education ((and special education)) program((s)).
- (4) Salaries and benefits for certificated instructional staff may 17 exceed the limitations in subsection (3) of this section only by 18 19 separate contract for additional time, additional responsibilities, or incentives. Supplemental contracts shall not cause the state to incur 20 any present or future funding obligation. Supplemental contracts shall 21 be subject to the collective bargaining provisions of chapter 41.59 RCW 22 and the provisions of RCW 28A.405.240, shall not exceed one year, and 23 24 if not renewed shall not constitute adverse change in accordance with RCW 28A.405.300 through 28A.405.380. No district may enter into a 25 26 supplemental contract under this subsection for the provision of services which are a part of the basic education program required by 27 Article IX, section 3 of the state Constitution. 28
- 29 (5) Employee benefit plans offered by any district shall comply 30 with RCW 28A.400.350 and 28A.400.275 and 28A.400.280.
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 3. This act takes effect September 1, 2002.
