1 AN ACT Relating to tax relief for disasters; adding a new section
2 to chapter 82.08 RCW; providing an expiration date; and declaring an
3 emergency.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

5 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 1.** A new section is added to chapter 82.08 RCW
6 to read as follows:

7 (1) The tax levied by RCW 82.08.020 does not apply to sales of
8 labor and services rendered in respect to:

9 (a) The moving of houses out of any landslide area that has been
10 declared as a federal disaster area;

11 (b) The demolition of houses located in a landslide area that has
12 been declared as a federal disaster area; or

13 (c) The removal of debris from a landslide area that has been
14 declared as a federal disaster area.

15 (2) This section expires July 1, 2003.

16 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 2.** Section 1 of this act is necessary for the
17 immediate preservation of the public peace, health, or safety, or

- 1 support of the state government and its existing public institutions,
- 2 and takes effect immediately.
