1 AN ACT Relating to notice requirements; and amending RCW 47.64.260.

2 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

3 **Sec. 1.** RCW 47.64.260 and 1983 c 15 s 17 are each amended to read
4 as follows:

5 Any notice required under this chapter shall be in writing, but
6 service thereof is sufficient if mailed by (~~restricted~~) certified
7 mail, return receipt requested, addressed to the last known address of
8 the parties, or sent by electronic facsimile transmission with
9 transaction report verification and same-day United States postal
10 service mailing of copies or service as specified in Title 316 WAC,
11 unless otherwise provided in this chapter. Refusal of (~~restricted~~)
12 certified mail by any party shall be considered service. Prescribed
13 time periods commence from the date of the receipt of the notice. Any
14 party may at any time execute and deliver an acceptance of service in
15 lieu of mailed notice.
