- 1 AN ACT Relating to establishing the eastern Washington veterans'
- 2 home; amending RCW 72.36.035, 72.36.045, 72.36.055, 72.36.060,
- 3 43.60A.075, and 72.36.090; adding a new section to chapter 72.36 RCW;
- 4 and creating a new section.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 6 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 1.** The department of veterans affairs indicates
- 7 that it may acquire and staff an existing one-hundred-bed skilled
- 8 nursing facility in Spokane and reopen it as an eastern Washington
- 9 veterans' home by using a combination of funding sources. Funding
- 10 sources include federal per diem payments, contributions from
- 11 residents' incomes, and federal and state medicaid payments. In
- 12 authorizing the establishment of an eastern Washington veterans' home,
- 13 it is the intent of the legislature that the state general fund shall
- 14 not provide support in future biennia for the eastern Washington
- 15 veterans' home except for amounts required to pay the state share of
- 16 medicaid costs.
- 17 **Sec. 2.** RCW 72.36.035 and 1993 sp.s. c 3 s 6 are each amended to
- 18 read as follows:

- 1 For purposes of this chapter, unless the context clearly indicates 2 otherwise:
- 3 (1) "Actual bona fide residents of this state" means persons who 4 have a domicile in the state of Washington immediately prior to 5 application for admission to a state veterans' home.
- 6 (2) "Department" means the Washington state department of veterans 7 affairs.
- 8 (3) "Domicile" means a person's true, fixed, and permanent home and 9 place of habitation, and shall be the place where the person intends to 10 remain, and to which the person expects to return when the person 11 leaves without intending to establish a new domicile elsewhere.
- 12 (4) "State veterans' homes" means ((either)) the Washington 13 soldiers' home and colony in Orting, ((er)) the Washington veterans' 14 home in Retsil, ((er both)) and the eastern Washington veterans' home.
- 15 (5) "Veteran" has the same meaning established in RCW 41.04.005.
- 16 **Sec. 3.** RCW 72.36.045 and 1977 ex.s. c 186 s 10 are each amended 17 to read as follows:
- In the maintenance of the ((Washington soldiers' home and colony and the Washington)) state veterans' homes by the state through the department of veterans' affairs, such maintenance shall include, but not be limited to, the provision of members' room and board, medical and dental care, physical and occupational therapy, and recreational activities, with the necessary implementing transportation, equipment,
- 25 **Sec. 4.** RCW 72.36.055 and 1977 ex.s. c 186 s 6 are each amended to 26 read as follows:
- The ((soldiers' home and colony at Orting and the Washington))

  state veterans' homes ((at Retsil)) shall provide both domiciliary and
  nursing care. The level of domiciliary members shall remain consistent
  with the facilities available to accommodate those members: PROVIDED,
  That nothing in this section shall preclude the department from moving
  residents between nursing and domiciliary care in order to better
  utilize facilities and maintain the appropriate care for the members.
- 34 **Sec. 5.** RCW 72.36.060 and 1977 ex.s. c 186 s 3 are each amended to 35 read as follows:

- The state treasurer is authorized to receive any and all moneys 1 2 appropriated or paid by the United States under the act of congress entitled "An Act to provide aid to state or territorial homes for 3 disabled soldiers and sailors of the United States, "approved August 4 5 27, 1888, or under any other act or acts of congress for the benefit of Such moneys shall be deposited in the general fund and 6 such homes. 7 shall be expended for the maintenance of the ((soldiers' home and)) state veterans' homes. 8
- 9 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 6.** A new section is added to chapter 72.36 RCW 10 to read as follows:
- There shall be established and maintained in this state a branch of the state soldiers' home, under the name of the "eastern Washington veterans' home," which branch shall be a home for veterans and their spouses who meet admission requirements contained in RCW 72.36.030.
- 15 **Sec. 7.** RCW 43.60A.075 and 1977 c 31 s 5 are each amended to read 16 as follows:
- The director of the department of veterans affairs shall have full power to manage and govern the state soldiers' home and colony ((and)), the Washington veterans' home, and the eastern Washington veterans' home.
- 21 **Sec. 8.** RCW 72.36.090 and 1977 ex.s. c 186 s 9 are each amended to 22 read as follows:
- The superintendents of the state ((soldiers' home and colony and the state)) veterans' homes are hereby authorized to:
- 25 (1) Institute programs of hobby promotion designed to improve the 26 general welfare and mental condition of the persons under their 27 supervision;
- (2) Provide for the financing of these programs by grants from funds in the superintendent's custody through operation of canteens and exchanges at such institutions;
- 31 (3) Limit the hobbies sponsored to projects which will, in their 32 judgment, be self-liquidating or self-sustaining.
