1 AN ACT Relating to resident tuition at institutions of higher
2 education; and amending RCW 28B.15.012.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

4 **Sec. 1.** RCW 28B.15.012 and 2002 c 186 s 2 are each amended to read
5 as follows:

6 Whenever used in chapter 28B.15 RCW:

7 (1) The term "institution" shall mean a public university, college,
8 or community college within the state of Washington.

9 (2) The term "resident student" shall mean:

10 (a) A financially independent student who has had a domicile in the
11 state of Washington for the period of one year immediately prior to the
12 time of commencement of the first day of the semester or quarter for
13 which the student has registered at any institution and has in fact
14 established a bona fide domicile in this state primarily for purposes
15 other than educational;

16 (b) A dependent student, if one or both of the student's parents or
17 legal guardians have maintained a bona fide domicile in the state of

1 Washington for at least one year immediately prior to commencement of
2 the semester or quarter for which the student has registered at any
3 institution;

4 (c) A student classified as a resident based upon domicile by an
5 institution on or before May 31, 1982, who was enrolled at a state
6 institution during any term of the 1982-1983 academic year, so long as
7 such student's enrollment (excepting summer sessions) at an institution
8 in this state is continuous;

9 (d) Any student who has spent at least seventy-five percent of both
10 his or her junior and senior years in high schools in this state, whose
11 parents or legal guardians have been domiciled in the state for a
12 period of at least one year within the five-year period before the
13 student graduates from high school, and who enrolls in a public
14 institution of higher education within six months of leaving high
15 school, for as long as the student remains continuously enrolled for
16 three quarters or two semesters in any calendar year;

17 (e) Any student who has graduated from high school in this state or
18 received the equivalent of a high school diploma in this state and who
19 has attended at least three years of high school in this state, however
20 a student who is not a citizen of the United States of America shall
21 file an application for permanent residency and engage in activities
22 necessary to acquire citizenship, including but not limited to taking
23 citizenship or civics review classes prior to completing a certificate
24 or degree program;

25 (f) A student who is on active military duty stationed in the state
26 or who is a member of the Washington national guard;

27 (~~(f)~~) (g) A student who is the spouse or a dependent of a person
28 who is on active military duty stationed in the state;

29 (~~(g)~~) (h) A student who resides in the state of Washington and is
30 the spouse or a dependent of a person who is a member of the Washington
31 national guard;

32 (~~(h)~~) (i) A student of an out-of-state institution of higher
33 education who is attending a Washington state institution of higher
34 education pursuant to a home tuition agreement as described in RCW
35 28B.15.725; or

36 (~~(i)~~) (j) A student who meets the requirements of RCW
37 28B.15.0131: PROVIDED, That a nonresident student enrolled for more
38 than six hours per semester or quarter shall be considered as attending

1 for primarily educational purposes, and for tuition and fee paying
2 purposes only such period of enrollment shall not be counted toward the
3 establishment of a bona fide domicile of one year in this state unless
4 such student proves that the student has in fact established a bona
5 fide domicile in this state primarily for purposes other than
6 educational.

7 (3) The term "nonresident student" shall mean any student who does
8 not qualify as a "resident student" under the provisions of RCW
9 28B.15.012 and 28B.15.013. Except for students qualifying under
10 subsection (2)((~~h~~)) (i) of this section, a nonresident student shall
11 include:

12 (a) A student attending an institution with the aid of financial
13 assistance provided by another state or governmental unit or agency
14 thereof, such nonresidency continuing for one year after the completion
15 of such semester or quarter.

16 (b) A person who is not a citizen of the United States of America
17 who does not have permanent or temporary resident status or does not
18 hold "Refugee-Parolee" or "Conditional Entrant" status with the United
19 States immigration and naturalization service or is not otherwise
20 permanently residing in the United States under color of law and who
21 does not also meet and comply with all the applicable requirements in
22 RCW 28B.15.012 and 28B.15.013.

23 (4) The term "domicile" shall denote a person's true, fixed and
24 permanent home and place of habitation. It is the place where the
25 student intends to remain, and to which the student expects to return
26 when the student leaves without intending to establish a new domicile
27 elsewhere. The burden of proof that a student, parent or guardian has
28 established a domicile in the state of Washington primarily for
29 purposes other than educational lies with the student.

30 (5) The term "dependent" shall mean a person who is not financially
31 independent. Factors to be considered in determining whether a person
32 is financially independent shall be set forth in rules and regulations
33 adopted by the higher education coordinating board and shall include,
34 but not be limited to, the state and federal income tax returns of the
35 person and/or the student's parents or legal guardian filed for the
36 calendar year prior to the year in which application is made and such

1 other evidence as the board may require.

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
