1 WHEREAS, The aerospace sector, as the state's largest manufacturing 2 and exporting industry, has made a significant contribution to local, 3 regional, state, and national economies; and

WHEREAS, Airports of regional significance in both eastern and western Washington have underutilized property and facilities that could become substantial tools for economic development; and

WHEREAS, An examination is needed to determine how untapped capacity at airports of regional significance can be used to expand manufacturing, research and development, education, and training for the aerospace industry;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, By the House of Representatives of the state of Washington, the Senate concurring, That a study of the potential for expanding the presence of aerospace manufacturing and associated research and development, education, and training businesses at airports of regional significance be conducted; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the study include a review of:

(1) The composition of the current aerospace manufacturing industry in Washington state and significant trends that affect retention, expansion, and recruitment of companies in that industry;

- (3) The inventory of untapped or underutilized capacity at airports of regional significance;
- (4) Types of aerospace manufacturing and associated businesses that could be sited at airports of regional significance;
- (5) Financial and technical resources that are available and those that would be needed; and
- 9 (6) Statutory and regulatory changes required to expand the 10 presence of aerospace manufacturing and associated businesses at 11 airports of regional significance; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the study be conducted by a joint task force of the House of Representatives and the Senate consisting of the following voting members:

- (1) One member from each caucus of the House of Representatives, appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives;
- (2) One member from each caucus of the Senate, appointed by the President of the Senate;
- (3) Three members representing the aerospace manufacturing and services industry, appointed jointly by the Speaker of the House of Representatives and the President of the Senate;
- (4) Two members representing airport owners and managers, one from eastern Washington and one from western Washington, appointed jointly by the Speaker of the House of Representatives and the President of the Senate;
- (5) Two members representing airport business tenants, appointed jointly by the Speaker of the House of Representatives and the President of the Senate;
- (6) Two members representing four-year institutions of higher education and work force training at community and technical colleges, appointed jointly by the Speaker of the House of Representatives and the President of the Senate;
- (7) Two members representing counties, one from eastern Washington and one from western Washington, appointed jointly by the Speaker of the House of Representatives and the President of the Senate;
- 36 (8) Two members from organized labor representing transportation 37 and aerospace workers, appointed jointly by the Speaker of the House of 38 Representatives and the President of the Senate;

(9) Two members representing cities near a regional airport, one from eastern Washington and one from western Washington, appointed jointly by the Speaker of the House of Representatives and the President of the Senate; and

(10) One member representing the Federal Aviation Administration, appointed jointly by the Speaker of the House of Representatives and the President of the Senate; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the task force shall choose bipartisan cochairs from among its legislative membership and request that the departments of transportation and community, trade, and economic development each appoint a representative, who shall be a nonvoting member; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the task force shall consult with individuals from the public and private sector, and may ask such persons to establish an advisory committee, and may contract with persons who have specific technical expertise, if such expertise is necessary to carry out the mandates of the study; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That staff support shall be provided by the House Office of Program Research and Senate Committee Services, the task force may use legislative or other public facilities, and the expenses of the task force shall be paid jointly by the House of Representatives and the Senate subject to approval by the House Executive Rules Committee and the Senate Facilities and Operations Committee, or their successor committees; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the task force shall report its findings and recommendations to the legislature by June 30, 2007.
