1 TO THE HONORABLE GEORGE W. BUSH, PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES, 2 AND TO THE PRESIDENT OF THE SENATE AND THE SPEAKER OF THE HOUSE OF 3 REPRESENTATIVES, AND TO THE SENATE AND HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE 4 UNITED STATES, IN CONGRESS ASSEMBLED:

5 We, your Memorialists, the Senate and House of Representatives of 6 the State of Washington, in legislative session assembled, respectfully 7 represent and petition as follows:

8 WHEREAS, Diabetes is now widely recognized as one of the top public 9 health threats facing our nation today and affects more than 18 million 10 Americans. In 2002, diabetes accounted for 132 billion dollars in 11 direct and indirect health care costs; and

12 WHEREAS, Diabetes now affects nearly 1.4 million Washington 13 residents: Over 298,000 people in Washington have been diagnosed with 14 diabetes; over 126,000 people have undiagnosed diabetes; and over 15 963,000 people have prediabetes; and

16 WHEREAS, People who have diabetes need skills to manage their 17 diabetes and skills to help them stay active in their lives. This 18 training is central to diabetes prevention and care; and

19 WHEREAS, Chronic disease self-management programs have a proven

success rate, allowing persons with diabetes to better control their
 diabetes; and

3 WHEREAS, Persons living with diabetes who are properly trained with 4 self-management skills are better able to prevent the deadly 5 complications of diabetes, which can include heart disease, stroke, 6 blindness, lower extremity amputation, and kidney failure; and

7 WHEREAS, Certified diabetes educators are highly trained
8 multidisciplinary health care professionals dedicated to delivering
9 quality diabetes self-management training; and

10 WHEREAS, Evidence has shown that access to a certified diabetes 11 educator improves the management of diabetes, a chronic illness that 12 requires a high level of maintenance; and

WHEREAS, Certified diabetes educators teach people with diabetes how to maintain the daily rigors of diet, exercise, meal planning, medication monitoring, healthy coping skills, and other factors necessary to control the disease; and

WHEREAS, Certified diabetes educators are also on the front line of the efforts to promote prevention of diabetes; and

WHEREAS, Congress recognized the value of diabetes self-management 19 training when it began covering the benefit in the Balanced Budget Act 20 21 of 1997. At that time, most certified diabetes educators worked in a 22 hospital setting and were able to bill Medicare for their services through the hospital's provider number. Unfortunately, during these 23 24 tough economic times, hospitals are closing their diabetes education 25 programs at a rate of two to five per month. This leaves diabetes educators without an avenue to provide or bill for diabetes education -26 27 services which are desperately needed to keep up with the growing number of people diagnosed with diabetes each day; and 28

WHEREAS, Certified diabetes educators have received extensive 29 training in diabetes management. They have met all criteria for 30 initial certification, including a prerequisite qualifying professional 31 32 credential in a specified health care profession, have professional practice experience in diabetes self-management training that includes 33 one thousand hours of diabetes teaching, have passed a national 34 examination offered by a certifying body recognized as entitled to 35 36 grant certification to diabetes educators, and are required to renew 37 the certification every five years;

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1 NOW, THEREFORE, Your Memorialists respectfully request that the 2 United States House of Representatives and the United States Senate 3 enact Senate Bill 626 and House Bill 3612, known as the "Diabetes Self-4 Management Training Act." The Act will increase access to diabetes 5 care by adding certified diabetes educators to the current list of 6 Medicare providers, thereby making certified diabetes educators 7 billable providers.

8 BE IT RESOLVED, That copies of this Memorial be immediately 9 transmitted to the Honorable George W. Bush, President of the United 10 States, the President of the United States Senate, the Speaker of the 11 House of Representatives, and each member of Congress from the State of 12 Washington.

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
