1 AN ACT Relating to the advisory committee of the office of public 2 defense; and amending RCW 2.70.030.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

4 Sec. 1. RCW 2.70.030 and 1996 c 221 s 4 are each amended to read 5 as follows:

6 (1) There is created an advisory committee consisting of the 7 following members:

8 (a) Three persons appointed by the chief justice of the supreme 9 court, including the chair of the appellate indigent defense commission 10 identified in subsection (3) of this section;

11 (b) Two nonattorneys appointed by the governor;

12 (c) Two senators, one from each of the two largest caucuses, 13 appointed by the president of the senate; and two members of the house 14 of representatives, one from each of the two largest caucuses, 15 appointed by the speaker of the house of representatives;

16 (d) One person appointed by the court of appeals executive 17 committee;

18 (e) One person appointed by the Washington state bar association.

1 (2) During the term of his or her appointment, no appointee may: 2 (a) Provide indigent defense services except on a pro bono basis; (b) 3 serve as an appellate judge <u>except on a pro tem basis</u> or <u>as</u> an 4 appellate court employee; or (c) serve as a prosecutor or prosecutor 5 employee.

(3) The initial advisory committee shall be comprised of the 6 7 current members of the appellate indigent defense commission, as established by Supreme Court Order No. 25700-B, dated March 9, 1995, 8 plus two additional legislator members appointed under subsection 9 (1)(c) of this section. Members shall serve until the termination of 10 their current terms, and may be reappointed. The two additional 11 legislator members, who are not on the appellate indigent defense 12 13 commission, shall each serve three-year terms. Members of the advisory 14 committee shall receive no compensation for their services as members of the commission, but may be reimbursed for travel and other expenses 15 in accordance with rules adopted by the office of financial management. 16 Passed by the House March 8, 2005.
