- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 4 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 1.** A new section is added to chapter 46.44 RCW to read as follows:
- 6 Motor homes, travel trailers, and campers may exceed the maximum
- 7 width established under RCW 46.44.010 if the excess width is
- 8 attributable to appurtenances that do not extend beyond the body of the
- 9 vehicle by more than four inches, or if an awning, by more than six
- 10 inches. As used in this section, "appurtenance" means an appendage
- 11 that is installed by a factory or a vehicle dealer and is intended as
- 12 an integral part of the motor home, travel trailer, or camper.
- 13 "Appurtenance" does not include an item temporarily affixed or attached
- 14 to the exterior of a vehicle for the purpose of transporting the item
- 15 from one location to another. "Appurtenance" does not include an item
- 16 that obstructs the driver's rearward vision.
