1 AN ACT Relating to the kinship care oversight committee; adding a 2 new section to chapter 74.13 RCW; and providing an expiration date.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

<u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 1. A new section is added to chapter 74.13 RCW to read as follows:

6 (1) Within existing resources, the department shall establish an 7 oversight committee to monitor, guide, and report on kinship care 8 recommendations and implementation activities. The committee shall:

9 (a) Draft a kinship care definition that is restricted to persons 10 related by blood, marriage, or adoption, including marriages that have been dissolved, or for a minor defined as an "Indian child" under the 11 federal Indian child welfare act (25 U.S.C. Sec. 1901 et seq.), the 12 definition of "extended family member" under the federal Indian child 13 welfare act, and a set of principles. If the committee concludes that 14 one or more programs or services would be more efficiently and 15 effectively delivered under a different definition of kin, it shall 16 state what definition is needed, and identify the program or service in 17 the report. It shall also provide evidence of how the program or 18

service will be more efficiently and effectively delivered under the different definition. The department shall not adopt rules or policies changing the definition of kin without authorizing legislation;

4 (b) Monitor and provide consultation on the implementation of 5 recommendations contained in the 2002 kinship care report, including 6 but not limited to the recommendations relating to legal and respite 7 care services and resources;

8 (c) Partner with nonprofit organizations and private sector9 businesses to guide a public education awareness campaign; and

10 (d) Assist with developing future recommendations on kinship care 11 issues.

(2) The department shall consult with the oversight committee on
its efforts to better collaborate and coordinate services to benefit
kinship care families.

(3) The oversight committee must consist of a minimum of thirty 15 percent kinship caregivers, who shall represent a diversity of kinship 16 17 families. Statewide representation with geographic, ethnic, and gender diversity is required. Other members shall include representatives of 18 19 the department, representatives of relevant state agencies, representatives of the private nonprofit and business sectors, child 20 21 advocates, representatives of Washington state Indian tribes as defined 22 under the federal Indian welfare act (25 U.S.C. Sec. 1901 et seq.), and representatives of the legal or judicial field. Birth parents, foster 23 24 parents, and others who have an interest in these issues may also be 25 included.

(4) To the extent funding is available, the department may
reimburse nondepartmental members of the oversight committee for costs
incurred in participating in the meetings of the oversight committee.

(5) The kinship care oversight committee shall update the legislature and governor annually on committee activities, with the first update due by January 1, 2006.
