1 AN ACT Relating to the surcharge for preservation of historical 2 documents; and amending RCW 36.22.170.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

4 **Sec. 1.** RCW 36.22.170 and 1993 c 37 s 1 are each amended to read 5 as follows:

(1)(a) Except as provided in (b) of this subsection, a surcharge of 6 7 ((two)) five dollars per instrument shall be charged by the county 8 auditor for each document recorded, which will be in addition to any other charge authorized by law. ((Fifty percent)) One dollar of the 9 10 surcharge shall be deposited in the county general fund to be used at the discretion of the county commissioners to promote historical 11 preservation or historical programs, which may include preservation of 12 13 historic documents.

14 (b) A surcharge of two dollars per instrument shall be charged by 15 the county auditor for each document presented for recording by the 16 employment security department, which will be in addition to any other 17 charge authorized by law.

18 (2) Of the <u>remaining</u> revenue generated through ((this)) the 19 surcharges under subsection (1) of this section: (a) Fifty percent

shall be transmitted monthly to the state treasurer who shall 1 2 distribute such funds to each county treasurer within the state in July of each year in accordance with the formula described in RCW 36.22.190. 3 The county treasurer shall place the funds received in a special 4 account titled the auditor's centennial document preservation and 5 modernization account to be used solely for ongoing preservation of 6 historical documents of all county offices and departments and shall 7 not be added to the county current expense fund((-)); and 8

9 (b) Fifty percent ((of the revenue generated by this surcharge)) 10 shall be retained by the county and deposited in the auditor's 11 operation and maintenance fund for ongoing preservation of historical 12 documents of all county offices and departments.

13 (3) The centennial document preservation and modernization account 14 is hereby created in the custody of the state treasurer and shall be 15 classified as a treasury trust account. State distributions from the 16 centennial document preservation and modernization account shall be 17 made without appropriation.
