AN ACT Relating to expanding membership of the electrical board by appointment of one outside line worker; amending RCW 19.28.311; and creating a new section.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

5 **Sec. 1.** RCW 19.28.311 and 2000 c 238 s 3 are each amended to read 6 as follows:

There is hereby created an electrical board, consisting of ((fourteen)) fifteen members to be appointed by the governor with the advice of the director of labor and industries as herein provided. shall be the purpose and function of the board to advise the director on all matters pertaining to the enforcement of this chapter including, but not limited to standards of electrical and telecommunications installation, minimum inspection procedures, and the adoption of rules pertaining to the electrical inspection division: PROVIDED, HOWEVER, That no rules shall be amended or repealed until the electrical board has first had an opportunity to consider any proposed amendments or repeals and had an opportunity to make recommendations to the director The members of the electrical board shall be relative thereto. selected and appointed as follows: One member shall be an employee or

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officer of a corporation or public agency generating or distributing 1 electric power; one member must be an employee or officer of a 2 facilities-based telecommunications service provider regulated by the 3 Washington state utilities and transportation commission; three members 4 shall be licensed electrical contractors: PROVIDED, That one of these 5 members may be a representative of a trade association in the 6 electrical industry; one member shall be a licensed telecommunications 7 8 contractor; one member shall be an employee, or officer, representative of a corporation or firm engaged in the business of 9 manufacturing or distributing electrical and telecommunications 10 materials, equipment, or devices; one member shall be a person with 11 12 knowledge of the electrical industry, not related to the electrical 13 industry, to represent the public; three members shall be certified electricians; one member shall be a telecommunications worker; one 14 member shall be a licensed professional electrical engineer qualified 15 to do business in the state of Washington and designated as a 16 registered communications distribution designer; one member shall be an 17 outside line worker; and one nonvoting member must be a building 18 official from an incorporated city or town with an electrical 19 inspection program established under RCW 19.28.141. The regular term 20 21 of each member shall be four years: PROVIDED, HOWEVER, The original 22 board shall be appointed on June 9, 1988, for the following terms: The first term of the member representing a corporation or public agency 23 24 generating or distributing electric power shall serve four years; two 25 members representing licensed electrical contractors shall serve three years; the member representing a manufacturer or distributor of 26 27 electrical equipment or devices shall serve three years; the member representing the public and one member representing licensed electrical 28 contractors shall serve two years; the three members selected as 29 certified electricians shall serve for terms of one, two, and three 30 years, respectively; the member selected as the licensed professional 31 32 electrical engineer shall serve for one year. In appointing the original board, the governor shall give due consideration to the value 33 of continuity in membership from predecessor boards. Thereafter, the 34 35 governor shall appoint or reappoint board members for terms of four 36 years and to fill vacancies created by the completion of the terms of 37 the original members. When new positions are created, the governor may 38 appoint the initial members to the new positions to staggered terms of

- one to three years. The governor shall also fill vacancies caused by 1 2 death, resignation, or otherwise for the unexpired term of such members by appointing their successors from the same business classification. 3 The same procedure shall be followed in making such subsequent 4 appointments as is provided for the original appointments. The board, 5 at this first meeting shall elect one of its members to serve as 6 7 Any person acting as the chief electrical inspector shall serve as secretary of the board during his or her tenure as chief state 8 inspector. Meetings of the board shall be held at least quarterly in 9 accordance with a schedule established by the board. Each member of 10 the board shall receive compensation in accordance with RCW 43.03.240 11 and shall be reimbursed for travel expenses in accordance with RCW 12 13 43.03.050 and 43.03.060 which shall be paid out of the electrical 14 license fund, upon vouchers approved by the director of labor and industries. 15
- NEW SECTION. **Sec. 2.** The governor shall appoint the member representing outside line workers within ninety days after the effective date of this act.
