BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON: 3

NEW SECTION. Sec. 1. A new section is added to chapter 28A.655 RCW to read as follows:

(1) It is the intent of the legislature, through the creation of 6 7 the apple award, to honor and reward students in Washington's public 8 elementary schools who have shown significant improvement in their school's results on the Washington assessment of student learning. 9

10 (2) The apple award program is created to honor and reward public 11 elementary schools that have the greatest combined average increase in 12 the percentage of students meeting the fourth grade reading, mathematics, and writing standards on the Washington assessment of 13 student learning each school year. The program shall be administered 14 15 by the state board of education.

(3) Within the amounts appropriated for this purpose, each school 16 that receives an apple award shall be provided with a twenty-five 17 thousand dollar grant to be used for capital construction purposes that 18 19 have been selected by students in the school and approved by the

- 1 district's school directors. The funds may be used exclusively for
- 2 capital construction projects on school property or on other public
- 3 property in the community, city, or county in which the school is
- 4 located.
