1            AN ACT Relating to the enhanced 911 advisory committee; amending  
2 RCW 38.52.530; adding a new section to chapter 38.52 RCW; and providing  
3 an expiration date.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

5            **Sec. 1.** RCW 38.52.530 and 2002 c 341 s 3 are each amended to read  
6 as follows:

7            The enhanced 911 advisory committee is created to advise and assist  
8 the state enhanced 911 coordinator in coordinating and facilitating the  
9 implementation and operation of enhanced 911 throughout the state. The  
10 director shall appoint members of the committee who represent diverse  
11 geographical areas of the state and include state residents who are  
12 members of the national emergency number association, the associated  
13 public communications officers Washington chapter, the Washington state  
14 fire chiefs association, the Washington association of sheriffs and  
15 police chiefs, the Washington state council of fire fighters, the  
16 Washington state council of police officers, the Washington ambulance  
17 association, the state fire protection policy board, the Washington  
18 fire commissioners association, the Washington state patrol, the  
19 association of Washington cities, the Washington state association of

1 counties, the utilities and transportation commission or commission  
2 staff, a representative of a voice over internet protocol company, and  
3 an equal number of representatives of large and small local exchange  
4 telephone companies and large and small radio communications service  
5 companies offering commercial mobile radio service in the state. This  
6 section expires December 31, (~~2006~~) 2011.

7 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 2.** A new section is added to chapter 38.52 RCW  
8 to read as follows:

9 On an annual basis, the enhanced 911 advisory committee shall  
10 provide an update on the status of enhanced 911 service in the state to  
11 the appropriate committees in the legislature.
