1 AN ACT Relating to honoring the Reverend Doctor Martin Luther King,
2 Jr.; and amending RCW 36.04.170.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

4 **Sec. 1.** RCW 36.04.170 and 1 H.C. s 13 are each amended to read as
5 follows:

6 King county shall consist of the territory bounded as follows, to
7 wit: Beginning at the point of intersection of the center of East
8 Passage (also known as Admiralty Inlet) on Puget Sound and the
9 northerly line of the Puyallup Indian Reservation (projected
10 northwesterly); thence southeasterly in a straight line along said
11 northerly line of Puyallup Indian Reservation and same extended to a
12 point on the east line of section thirty-one, township twenty-one,
13 north, range four east, Willamette Meridian; thence south along said
14 east line of section thirty-one, township twenty-one, range four east,
15 Willamette Meridian, to the township line between township twenty north
16 and township twenty-one north (being the fifth standard parallel
17 north); thence east along said township line between township twenty
18 north and township twenty-one north to the middle of the main channel
19 of White river, near the northeast corner of section three, township

1 twenty north, range five east, Willamette Meridian; thence upstream
2 along the middle of the main channel of White river to the forks of
3 White river and Greenwater river; thence upstream along the middle of
4 the main channel of the Greenwater river to the forks of the Greenwater
5 river and Meadow creek; thence upstream along the middle of the main
6 channel of Meadow creek to the summit of the Cascade mountains, at a
7 point known as Naches Pass, said point lying in the southwest quarter
8 of section thirty-five, township nineteen north, range eleven east,
9 Willamette Meridian; thence northerly along the summit of the Cascade
10 mountains to a point on the township line between township twenty-six
11 north and township twenty-seven north, said point lying near the north
12 quarter-corner of section three, township twenty-six north, range
13 thirteen east, Willamette Meridian; thence west along said township
14 line between township twenty-six north and twenty-seven north to the
15 middle of the channel known as Admiralty Inlet on Puget Sound; thence
16 southerly along said middle of channel known as Admiralty Inlet through
17 Colvo's Passage (West Passage) on the west side of Vashon Island to a
18 point due north of Point Defiance; thence southeasterly along middle of
19 channel between Vashon Island and Point Defiance (Dalcos Passage) to a
20 point due south of Quartermaster Harbor; thence northeasterly along
21 middle of channel known as Admiralty Inlet to point of beginning. King
22 county is renamed in honor of the Reverend Doctor Martin Luther King,
23 Jr.
