1 TO THE HONORABLE PAULA HAMMOND, SECRETARY OF TRANSPORTATION, AND TO
2 THE WASHINGTON STATE TRANSPORTATION COMMISSION, AND TO THE WASHINGTON

2 construction of a new Tacoma Narrows bridge that will serve the

5 WHEREAS, Bob Oke's life will always be remembered by those who knew
6 him for his integrity, honor, humility, faith, and unshakable optimism;

8 WHEREAS, Bob Oke devoted his love to Mrs. Oke, his beloved wife,
9 best friend, and companion for thirty-one wonderful years, and together
10 they devoted their life to their family of 3 daughters, 1 son, and 9
11 grandchildren;

13 Washington State Transportation Commission name the new Tacoma Narrows
14 bridge the Bob Oke bridge.
