<u>(1)</u> Every person who:

7 (((1))) (a) Manufactures, sells, or disposes of or possesses any 8 instrument or weapon of the kind usually known as slung shot, sand 9 club, or metal knuckles, or spring blade knife, or any knife the blade 10 of which is automatically released by a spring mechanism or other 11 mechanical device, or any knife having a blade which opens, or falls, 12 or is ejected into position by the force of gravity, or by an outward, 13 downward, or centrifugal thrust or movement;

14 (((2))) <u>(b)</u> Furtively carries with intent to conceal any dagger, 15 dirk, pistol, or other dangerous weapon; or

16 (((3))) <u>(c)</u> Uses any contrivance or device for suppressing the 17 noise of any firearm,

18 is guilty of a gross misdemeanor punishable under chapter 9A.20 RCW.

19 (2) Subsection (1)(a) of this section does not apply to:

- 1 (a) The possession of a spring blade knife by a law enforcement
- 2 officer while the officer:
- 3 <u>(i) Is on official duty; or</u>
- 4 (ii) Is transporting the knife to or from the place where the knife
- 5 is stored when the officer is not on official duty; or
- 6 (b) The storage of a spring blade knife by a law enforcement
- 7 <u>officer.</u>
