1            AN ACT Relating to notice to individuals convicted of a sex offense  
2 as a juvenile of their ability to terminate registration requirements;  
3 and amending RCW 9A.44.145.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

5            **Sec. 1.** RCW 9A.44.145 and 1998 c 139 s 2 are each amended to read  
6 as follows:

7            (1) The state patrol shall notify:

8            (a) Registered sex and kidnapping offenders of any change to the  
9 registration requirements; and

10            (b) No less than annually, an offender having a duty to register  
11 under RCW 9A.44.130 for a sex offense or kidnapping offense committed  
12 when the offender was a juvenile of their ability to petition for  
13 relief from registration as provided in RCW 9A.44.140.

14            (2) For economic efficiency, the state patrol may combine the  
15 notices in this section into one notice.
