1 AN ACT Relating to institutions of higher education services and 2 activities fees; amending RCW 28B.15.045; and creating a new section.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

<u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 1. The legislature recognizes that students play an important role in recommending how services and activities fees should be expended, as the majority of members of the services and activities fees committee at each institution of higher education. It is the intent of the legislature to increase transparency, so that expenditures of revenue from services and activities fees are clearly visible and accessible to the students who pay those fees.

11 **Sec. 2.** RCW 28B.15.045 and 1994 c 41 s 1 are each amended to read 12 as follows:

The legislature recognizes that institutional governing boards have a responsibility to manage and protect institutions of higher education. This responsibility includes ensuring certain lawful agreements for which revenues from services and activities fees have been pledged. Such lawful agreements include, but are not limited to, bond covenant agreements and other contractual obligations.
Institutional governing boards are also expected to protect the
stability of programs that benefit students.

The legislature also recognizes that services and activities fees 4 5 are paid by students for the express purpose of funding student services and programs. It is the intent of the legislature that б 7 governing boards ensure that students have a strong voice in recommending budgets for services and activities fees. The boards of 8 trustees and the boards of regents of the respective institutions of 9 10 higher education shall adopt guidelines governing the establishment and funding of programs supported by services and activities fees. 11 Such 12 guidelines shall stipulate procedures for budgeting and expending 13 services and activities fee revenue. Any such guidelines shall be 14 consistent with the following provisions:

(1) Student representatives from the services and activities fee committee and representatives of the college or university administration shall have an opportunity to address the board before board decisions on services and activities fee budgets and dispute resolution actions are made.

(2) Members of the governing boards shall adhere to the principle that services and activities fee committee desires be given priority consideration on funding items that do not fall into the categories of preexisting contractual obligations, bond covenant agreements, or stability for programs affecting students.

(3) Responsibility for proposing to the administration and the 25 governing board program priorities and budget levels for that portion 26 27 of program budgets that derive from services and activities fees shall reside with a services and activities fee committee, on which students 28 shall hold at least a majority of the voting memberships, such student 29 members shall represent diverse student interests, and shall be 30 recommended by the student government association or its equivalent. 31 32 The chairperson of the services and activities fee committee shall be selected by the members of that committee. The governing board shall 33 insure that the services and activities fee committee provides an 34 opportunity for all viewpoints to be heard at a public meeting during 35 its consideration of the funding of student programs and activities. 36

37 (4) The services and activities fee committee shall evaluate38 existing and proposed programs and submit budget recommendations for

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1 the expenditure of those services and activities fees with supporting 2 documents simultaneously to the college or university governing board 3 and administration.

(5) The college or university administration shall review the 4 services and activities fee committee budget recommendations and 5 publish a written response to the services and activities fee б 7 committee. This response shall outline potential areas of difference between the committee recommendations and the administration's proposed 8 budget recommendations. This response, with supporting documentation, 9 shall be submitted to the services and activities fee committee in a 10 timely manner to allow adequate consideration. 11

12 (6)(a) In the event of a dispute or disputes involving the services 13 and activities fee committee recommendations, the college or university 14 administration shall meet with the services and activities fee 15 committee in a good faith effort to resolve such dispute or disputes 16 prior to submittal of final recommendations to the governing board.

(b) If said dispute is not resolved within fourteen days, a dispute resolution committee shall be convened by the chair of the services and activities fee committee within fourteen days.

(7) The dispute resolution committee shall be selected as follows: 20 21 The college or university administration shall appoint two nonvoting 22 advisory members; the governing board shall appoint three voting members; and the services and activities fee committee chair shall 23 24 appoint three student members of the services and activities fee committee who will have a vote, and one student representing the 25 services and activities fee committee who will chair the dispute 26 27 resolution committee and be nonvoting. The committee shall meet in good faith, and settle by vote any and all disputes. In the event of 28 a tie vote, the chair of the dispute resolution committee shall vote to 29 30 settle the dispute.

31 (8) The governing board may take action on those portions of the 32 services and activities fee budget not in dispute in accordance with 33 the customary budget approval timeline established by the board. The 34 governing board shall consider the results, if any, of the dispute 35 resolution committee and shall take action.

(9) Services and activities fees and revenues generated by programs
and activities funded by such fees shall be deposited and expended
through the office of the chief fiscal officer of the institution.

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1 (10) Services and activities fees and revenues generated by 2 programs and activities funded by such fees shall be subject to the 3 applicable policies, regulations, and procedures of the institution and 4 the budget and accounting act, chapter 43.88 RCW.

(11) All information pertaining to services and activities fees 5 budgets shall be made available to interested parties. <u>Annually, by</u> 6 7 September 30th, the services and activities fees committee at each institution __of __higher __education, __in __coordination __with __the 8 administration_of_the_institution_of_higher_education,_shall_post 9 services and activities fees expenditure information for the prior 10 academic year on the college or university web site so that the 11 12 information is clearly visible and easily accessible to students and 13 the public. At a minimum, the services and activities fees budget 14 information must include all the major categories of expenditure and the amounts expended in each category. 15

(12) With the exception of any funds needed for bond covenant 16 obligations, once the budget for expending service and activities fees 17 is approved by the governing board, funds shall not be shifted from 18 funds budgeted for associated students or departmentally related 19 categories or the reserve fund until the administration provides 20 21 written justification to the services and activities fee committee and 22 the governing board, and the governing board and the services and activities fee committee give their express approval. In the event of 23 24 a fund transfer dispute among the services and activities fee committee, the administration, or the governing board, said dispute 25 shall be resolved pursuant to subsections (6)(b), (7), and (8) of this 26 27 section.

(13) Any service and activities fees collected which exceed
initially budgeted amounts are subject to subsections (1) through (10)
and (12) of this section.
