1 AN ACT Relating to domestic violence fatality review panels; and 2 amending RCW 43.235.020, 43.235.030, and 43.235.800.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

4 **Sec. 1.** RCW 43.235.020 and 2000 c 50 s 2 are each amended to read 5 as follows:

6 (1) Subject to the availability of state funds, the department 7 shall contract with an entity with expertise in domestic violence 8 policy and education and with a statewide perspective to coordinate 9 review of domestic violence fatalities. The coordinating entity shall 10 be authorized to:

11 12 (a) Convene regional review panels;

(b) <u>Convene statewide issue-specific review panels;</u>

13 (c) Gather information for use of regional <u>or statewide issue-</u> 14 <u>specific</u> review panels;

15 (((c))) <u>(d)</u> Provide training and technical assistance to regional 16 <u>or statewide issue-specific</u> review panels;

17 ((((d))) <u>(e)</u> Compile information and issue ((biennial)) reports with 18 recommendations; and 1 (((e))) <u>(f)</u> Establish a protocol that may be used as a guideline 2 for identifying domestic violence related fatalities, forming review 3 panels, convening reviews, and selecting which cases to review. The 4 coordinating entity may also establish protocols for data collection 5 and preservation of confidentiality.

6 (2)(a) The coordinating entity may convene a regional <u>or statewide</u>
7 <u>issue-specific</u> domestic violence fatality review panel to review any
8 domestic violence fatality.

9 (b) Private citizens may request a review of a particular death by 10 submitting a written request to the coordinating entity within two 11 years of the death. Of these, the appropriate regional review panel 12 may review those cases which fit the criteria set forth in the protocol 13 for the project.

14 **Sec. 2.** RCW 43.235.030 and 2000 c 50 s 3 are each amended to read 15 as follows:

16 (1) Regional domestic violence fatality review panels ((shall)) may 17 include ((but not be limited to)), as appropriate, the following:

18 (a) Medical personnel with expertise in domestic violence abuse;

(b) Coroners or medical examiners or others experienced in thefield of forensic pathology, if available;

21 (c) County prosecuting attorneys ((and)) or municipal attorneys;

(d) Domestic violence shelter service staff ((and)) or domestic violence victims' advocates;

24 (e) Law enforcement personnel;

25 (f) Local health department staff;

26 (g) Child protective services workers;

27 (h) Community corrections professionals;

28 (i) Perpetrator treatment program provider; ((and))

29 (j) <u>School_teachers, guidance_counselors, or_student_health</u> 30 <u>services staff; and</u>

(k) Judges, court administrators, and/or their representatives.

(2) Regional domestic violence fatality review panels may also
invite other relevant persons to serve on an ad hoc basis and
participate as full members of the review ((team [panel])) panel for a
particular review. These persons may include, but are not limited to:
(a) Individuals with particular expertise helpful to the regional
review panel;

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(b) Representatives of organizations or agencies that had contact
with or provided services to the homicide victim or to the alleged
perpetrator.

4 (3) The regional review panels shall make periodic reports to the 5 coordinating entity and shall make a final report to the coordinating 6 entity with regard to every fatality that is reviewed.

7 <u>(4) Statewide issue-specific panels must include persons with</u> 8 particular subject matter expertise helpful to the panel. The 9 statewide issue-specific review panels must make periodic reports to 10 the coordinating entity and must make a final report to the 11 coordinating entity for every fatality that is reviewed.

12 **Sec. 3.** RCW 43.235.800 and 2000 c 50 s 7 are each amended to read 13 as follows:

(((1))) A biennial statewide report shall be issued by the 14 coordinating entity in December of even-numbered years, ending in 2010. 15 16 The coordinating entity may subsequently issue periodic reports 17 containing recommendations on policy changes that would improve program performance, and issues identified through the work of the regional 18 19 panels. Copies of this report shall be distributed to the governor, 20 ((the-house-of-representatives-children-and-family-services-and 21 criminal-justice-and-corrections-committees,-and-the-senate-human services and corrections and judiciary)) to the appropriate legislative 22 23 committees, and to those agencies involved in the regional domestic 24 violence fatality review panels.

25 (((2) - The - annual - report - in - December - 2010 - shall - contain - a 26 recommendation - as - to - whether - or - not - the - domestic - violence - review 27 process provided for in this - chapter should continue or be terminated

28 by the legislature.))
