1 AN ACT Relating to special parking privileges for persons with
2 disabilities; amending RCW 46.19.010, 46.19.020, 46.19.030, 46.19.050,
3 46.61.582, 46.61.583, and 46.63.020; creating a new section;
4 prescribing penalties; and providing an effective date.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

6 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 1.** (1) The legislature finds that there is a
7 history of abuse of special parking privileges for persons with
8 disabilities that requires changes to maintain public safety and good
9 order.

10 (2) It is the intent of the legislature to: (a) Decrease the
11 amount of unlawful use of special parking privileges for persons with
12 disabilities; (b) not create additional burdens for those in need of
13 special parking privileges for persons with disabilities; (c) provide
14 local jurisdictions with the authority to improve their administration
15 of on-street parking; (d) encourage the department of licensing to
16 implement the recommendations of the disabled parking work group in
17 regards to placard and application changes; and (e) encourage the
18 department of licensing to consider parking information system upgrades

1 related to special parking privileges for persons with disabilities in
2 its pursuit of technology modernization.

3 **Sec. 2.** RCW 46.19.010 and 2011 c 96 s 32 are each amended to read
4 as follows:

5 (1) A natural person who has a disability that meets one of the
6 following criteria may apply for special parking privileges:

7 (a) Cannot walk two hundred feet without stopping to rest;

8 (b) Is severely limited in ability to walk due to arthritic,
9 neurological, or orthopedic condition;

10 (c) Has such a severe disability that the person cannot walk
11 without the use of or assistance from a brace, cane, another person,
12 prosthetic device, wheelchair, or other assistive device;

13 (d) Uses portable oxygen;

14 (e) Is restricted by lung disease to an extent that forced
15 expiratory respiratory volume, when measured by spirometry, is less
16 than one liter per second or the arterial oxygen tension is less than
17 sixty mm/hg on room air at rest;

18 (f) Impairment by cardiovascular disease or cardiac condition to
19 the extent that the person's functional limitations are classified as
20 class III or IV under standards accepted by the American heart
21 association;

22 (g) Has a disability resulting from an acute sensitivity to
23 automobile emissions that limits or impairs the ability to walk. The
24 personal physician, advanced registered nurse practitioner, or
25 physician assistant of the applicant shall document that the disability
26 is comparable in severity to the others listed in this subsection;

27 (h) Has limited mobility and has no vision or whose vision with
28 corrective lenses is so limited that the person requires alternative
29 methods or skills to do efficiently those things that are ordinarily
30 done with sight by persons with normal vision;

31 (i) Has an eye condition of a progressive nature that may lead to
32 blindness; or

33 (j) Is restricted by a form of porphyria to the extent that the
34 applicant would significantly benefit from a decrease in exposure to
35 light.

36 (2) The disability must be determined by either:

37 (a) A licensed physician;

1 (b) An advanced registered nurse practitioner licensed under
2 chapter 18.79 RCW; or

3 (c) A physician assistant licensed under chapter 18.71A or 18.57A
4 RCW.

5 (3) A health care practitioner listed under subsection (2) of this
6 section must provide a signed written authorization on tamper-resistant
7 prescription pad or paper, as defined in RCW 18.64.500, if the
8 practitioner has prescriptive authority. An authorized health care
9 practitioner without prescriptive authority must provide the signed
10 written authorization on his or her office letterhead. Such
11 authorizations must be attached to the application for special parking
12 privileges for persons with disabilities.

13 (4) The application for special parking privileges for persons with
14 disabilities must contain:

15 (a) The following statement immediately below the physician's,
16 advanced registered nurse practitioner's, or physician assistant's
17 signature: "A parking permit for a person with disabilities may be
18 issued only for a medical necessity that severely affects mobility or
19 involves acute sensitivity to light (RCW 46.19.010). (~~Knowingly~~
20 ~~providing — false — information — on — this — application — is — a — gross~~
21 ~~misdemeanor.~~) An applicant or health care practitioner who knowingly
22 provides false information on this application is guilty of a gross
23 misdemeanor. The penalty is up to three hundred sixty-four days in
24 jail and a fine of up to \$5,000 or both. In addition, the health care
25 practitioner may be subject to sanctions under chapter 18.130 RCW, the
26 Uniform Disciplinary Act"; and

27 (b) Other information as required by the department.

28 (~~(+4)~~) (5) A natural person who has a disability described in
29 subsection (1) of this section and is expected to improve within
30 (~~six~~) twelve months may be issued a temporary placard for a period
31 not to exceed (~~six~~) twelve months. If the disability exists after
32 (~~six~~) twelve months, a new temporary placard must be issued upon
33 receipt of a new application with certification from the person's
34 physician as prescribed in subsections (3) and (4) of this section.
35 Special license plates for persons with disabilities may not be issued
36 to a person with a temporary disability.

37 (~~(+5)~~) (6) A natural person who qualifies for special parking

1 privileges under this section must receive an identification card
2 showing the name and date of birth of the person to whom the parking
3 privilege has been issued and the serial number of the placard.

4 ~~((+6+))~~ (7) A natural person who qualifies for permanent special
5 parking privileges under this section may receive one of the following:

6 (a) Up to two parking placards;

7 (b) One set of special license plates for persons with disabilities
8 if the person with the disability is the registered owner of the
9 vehicle on which the license plates will be displayed;

10 (c) One parking placard and one set of special license plates for
11 persons with disabilities if the person with the disability is the
12 registered owner of the vehicle on which the license plates will be
13 displayed; or

14 (d) One special parking year tab for persons with disabilities and
15 one parking placard.

16 ~~((+7+))~~ (8) Parking placards and identification cards described in
17 this section must be issued free of charge.

18 ~~((+8+))~~ (9) The parking placard and identification card must be
19 immediately returned to the department upon the placard holder's death.

20 **Sec. 3.** RCW 46.19.020 and 2012 c 10 s 42 are each amended to read
21 as follows:

22 (1) The following organizations may apply for special parking
23 privileges:

24 (a) Public transportation authorities;

25 (b) Nursing homes licensed under chapter 18.51 RCW;

26 (c) Assisted living facilities licensed under chapter 18.20 RCW;

27 (d) Senior citizen centers;

28 (e) Accessible van rental companies registered under RCW 46.87.023;

29 (f) Private nonprofit corporations, as defined in RCW 24.03.005;
30 and

31 ~~((+f+))~~ (g) Cabulance companies that regularly transport persons
32 with disabilities who have been determined eligible for special parking
33 privileges under this section and who are registered with the
34 department under chapter 46.72 RCW.

35 (2) An organization that qualifies for special parking privileges
36 may receive, upon application, ~~((parking))~~ special license plates or

1 parking placards, or both, for persons with disabilities as defined by
2 the department.

3 (3) Public transportation authorities, nursing homes, assisted
4 living facilities, senior citizen centers, accessible van rental
5 companies, private nonprofit corporations, and cabulance services are
6 responsible for ensuring that the (~~special~~) parking placards and
7 special license plates are not used improperly and are responsible for
8 all fines and penalties for improper use.

9 (4) The department shall adopt rules to determine organization
10 eligibility.

11 **Sec. 4.** RCW 46.19.030 and 2010 c 161 s 704 are each amended to
12 read as follows:

13 (1) The department shall design special license plates for persons
14 with disabilities, parking placards, and year tabs displaying the
15 international symbol of access.

16 (2) Special license plates for persons with disabilities must be
17 displayed on the motor vehicle as standard issue license plates as
18 described in RCW 46.16A.200.

19 (3) Parking placards must include both a serial number and the
20 expiration date on the face of the placard. The expiration date and
21 serial number must be of a sufficient size as to be easily visible from
22 a distance of ten feet from where the placard is displayed.

23 (4) Parking placards must be displayed when the motor vehicle is
24 parked by suspending it from the rearview mirror. In the absence of a
25 rearview mirror, the parking placard must be displayed on the
26 dashboard. The parking placard must be displayed in a manner that
27 allows for the entire placard to be viewed through the vehicle
28 windshield.

29 (~~(4)~~) (5) Special year tabs for persons with disabilities must be
30 displayed on license plates as defined by the department.

31 (~~(5)~~) (6) Persons who have been issued special license plates for
32 persons with disabilities, parking placards, or special license plates
33 with a special year tab for persons with disabilities may park in
34 places reserved for persons with physical disabilities.

35 **Sec. 5.** RCW 46.19.050 and 2011 c 171 s 74 are each amended to read
36 as follows:

1 (1) **False information.** Knowingly providing false information in
2 conjunction with the application for special parking privileges for
3 persons with disabilities is a gross misdemeanor punishable under
4 chapter 9A.20 RCW.

5 (2) **Unauthorized use.** Any unauthorized use of the (~~special~~)
6 parking placard, special license (~~plate~~) plate, special year tab,
7 or identification card issued under this chapter is a parking
8 infraction with a monetary penalty of two hundred fifty dollars. In
9 addition to any penalty or fine imposed under this subsection, two
10 hundred dollars must be assessed. For the purpose of this subsection,
11 "unauthorized use" includes (a) any use of a parking placard, special
12 license plate, special year tab, or identification card that is
13 expired, inactivated, faked, forged, or counterfeited, (b) any use of
14 a parking placard, special license plate, special year tab, or
15 identification card of another holder if the initial holder is no
16 longer eligible to use or receive it, and (c) any use of a parking
17 placard, special license plate, special year tab, or identification
18 card of another holder even if permitted to do so by the holder.

19 (3) **Inaccessible access.** It is a parking infraction, with a
20 monetary penalty of two hundred fifty dollars, for a person to stop,
21 stand, or park in, block, or otherwise make inaccessible the access
22 aisle located next to a space reserved for persons with physical
23 disabilities. In addition to any penalty or fine imposed under this
24 subsection, two hundred dollars must be assessed. The clerk of the
25 court shall report all violations related to this subsection to the
26 department.

27 (4) **Parking without placard/plate.** It is a parking infraction,
28 with a monetary penalty of two hundred fifty dollars, for any person to
29 park a vehicle in a parking place provided on private property without
30 charge or on public property reserved for persons with physical
31 disabilities without a placard or special license plate issued under
32 this chapter. In addition to any penalty or fine imposed under this
33 subsection, two hundred dollars must be assessed. If a person is
34 charged with a violation, the person will not be determined to have
35 committed an infraction if the person (~~produces in court or before the~~
36 ~~court appearance the placard or special license plate~~) establishes
37 that the person operating the vehicle or being transported at the time
38 of the infraction had a valid placard, special license plate, or

1 special_year_tab issued under this chapter as required under this
2 chapter. ~~((A local jurisdiction providing nonmetered, on-street~~
3 ~~parking places reserved for persons with physical disabilities may~~
4 ~~impose by ordinance time restrictions of no less than four hours on the~~
5 ~~use of these parking places.)) Such person must sign a statement under
6 penalty of perjury that the placard, special license plate, or special
7 year tab produced prior to the court appearance was valid at the time
8 of infraction and issued under this chapter as required under this
9 chapter.~~

10 (5) **Time restrictions.** A local jurisdiction may impose by
11 ordinance time restrictions of no less than four hours on the use of
12 nonreserved, on-street parking spaces by vehicles displaying the
13 special parking placards or special license plates issued under this
14 chapter. All time restrictions must be clearly posted.

15 (6) **Improper display of placard/plate.** It is a parking infraction,
16 with a monetary penalty of two hundred fifty dollars, to fail to fully
17 display a placard or special license plate issued under this chapter
18 while parked in a public place on private property without charge,
19 while parked on public property reserved for persons with physical
20 disabilities, or while parking free of charge as allowed under RCW
21 46.61.582. In addition to any penalty or fine imposed under this
22 subsection, two hundred dollars must be assessed, for a total of four
23 hundred fifty dollars. For the purpose of this subsection, "fully
24 display" means hanging or placing the placard or special license plate
25 so that the full face of the placard or license plate is visible,
26 including the serial number and expiration date of the license plate or
27 placard. If a person is charged with a violation of this subsection,
28 that person will not be determined to have committed an infraction if
29 the person produces in court or before the court appearance a valid
30 identification card issued to that person under RCW 46.19.010.

31 ~~((+6))~~ (7) **Allocation and use of funds - reimbursement.** (a) The
32 assessment imposed under subsections (2), (3), ~~((and))~~ (4), and (6) of
33 this section must be allocated as follows:

34 (i) One hundred dollars must be deposited in the accessible
35 communities account created in RCW 50.40.071; and

36 (ii) One hundred dollars must be deposited in the multimodal
37 transportation account under RCW 47.66.070 for the sole purpose of

1 supplementing a grant program for special needs transportation provided
2 by transit agencies and nonprofit providers of transportation that is
3 administered by the department of transportation.

4 (b) Any reduction in any penalty or fine and assessment imposed
5 under subsections (2), (3), ~~((and))~~ (4), and (6) of this section must
6 be applied proportionally between the penalty or fine and the
7 assessment. When a reduced penalty is imposed under subsection (2),
8 (3), ~~((or))~~ (4), or (6) of this section, the amount deposited in the
9 accounts identified in (a) of this subsection must be reduced equally
10 and proportionally.

11 (c) The penalty or fine amounts must be used by that local
12 jurisdiction exclusively for law enforcement. The court may also
13 impose an additional penalty sufficient to reimburse the local
14 jurisdiction for any costs that it may have incurred in the removal and
15 storage of the improperly parked vehicle.

16 ~~((+7))~~ **(8) Illegal obtainment.** Except as provided in subsection
17 (1) of this section, it is a ~~((traffic infraction with a monetary
18 penalty of two hundred fifty dollars))~~ misdemeanor punishable under
19 chapter 9A.20 RCW for any person willfully to obtain a special license
20 plate, placard, special year tab, or identification card issued under
21 this chapter in a manner other than that established under this
22 chapter.

23 ~~((+8))~~ **(9) Sale of a placard/plate/tab/card.** It is a misdemeanor
24 punishable under chapter 9A.20 RCW for any person to sell a placard,
25 special license plate, special year tab, or identification card issued
26 under this chapter.

27 **(10) Volunteer appointment.** A law enforcement agency authorized to
28 enforce parking laws may appoint volunteers, with a limited commission,
29 to issue notices of infractions for violations of subsections (2), (3),
30 (4), and (6) of this section or RCW ~~((46.19.010 and))~~ 46.19.030 or
31 46.61.581. Volunteers must be at least twenty-one years of age. The
32 law enforcement agency appointing volunteers may establish any other
33 qualifications that the agency deems desirable.

34 (a) An agency appointing volunteers under this section must provide
35 training to the volunteers before authorizing them to issue notices of
36 infractions.

37 (b) A notice of infraction issued by a volunteer appointed under

1 this subsection has the same force and effect as a notice of infraction
2 issued by a ~~((police))~~ peace officer for the same offense.

3 (c) A ~~((police))~~ peace officer or a volunteer may request a person
4 to show the person's identification card or special parking placard
5 when investigating the possibility of a violation of this section. If
6 the request is refused, the person in charge of the vehicle may be
7 issued a notice of infraction for a violation of this section.

8 ~~((+9))~~ (11) Surrender of a placard/plate/tab/card. If a person is
9 found to have violated the special parking privileges provided in this
10 chapter, and unless an appeal of that finding is pending, a judge may
11 order that the person surrender his or her placard, special license
12 plate, special year tab, or identification card issued under this
13 chapter.

14 (12)Community restitution. For second or subsequent violations of
15 this section, in addition to a monetary penalty, the violator must
16 complete a minimum of forty hours of:

17 (a) Community restitution for a nonprofit organization that serves
18 persons with disabilities or disabling diseases; or

19 (b) Any other community restitution that may sensitize the violator
20 to the needs and obstacles faced by persons with disabilities.

21 ~~((+10))~~ (13)Fine suspension. The court may not suspend more than
22 one-half of any fine imposed under subsection (2), (3), (4), or ~~((+7))~~
23 (6) of this section.

24 **Sec. 6.** RCW 46.61.582 and 2011 c 171 s 80 are each amended to read
25 as follows:

26 (1) Any person who meets the criteria for special parking
27 privileges under RCW 46.19.010 ~~((shall))~~ must be allowed free of charge
28 to park a vehicle being used to transport ~~((that person))~~ the holder of
29 such special parking privileges for unlimited periods of time in
30 parking zones or areas, including zones or areas with parking meters
31 ~~((which))~~ that are otherwise restricted as to the length of time
32 parking is permitted, except zones in which parking is limited pursuant
33 to RCW 46.19.050(5). ~~((This section does not apply to those zones or~~
34 ~~areas in which the stopping, parking, or standing of all vehicles is~~
35 ~~prohibited or which are reserved for special types of vehicles.))~~ The

8 A special license plate or card issued by another state or country
9 that indicates an occupant of the vehicle (~~(is disabled,)~~) has a
10 disability entitles the vehicle on or in which it is displayed and
11 being used to transport the (~~(disabled)~~) person with disabilities to
12 the same (~~(overtime)~~) parking privileges granted under this chapter to
13 a vehicle with a similar special license plate or card issued by this
14 state.
