1 AN ACT Relating to birth certificates and other birth-related 2 information; and amending RCW 26.33.345.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

4 Sec. 1. RCW 26.33.345 and 1993 c 81 s 3 are each amended to read 5 as follows:

The department of social and health services, 6 (1) adoption 7 agencies, and independent adoption facilitators shall release the name 8 and location of the court where a relinquishment of parental rights or 9 finalization of an adoption took place to an adult adoptee, a birth 10 parent of an adult adoptee, an adoptive parent, a birth or adoptive grandparent of an adult adoptee, or an adult sibling of an adult 11 12 adoptee, or the legal guardian of any of these.

13 (2) The department of health shall make available a noncertified 14 copy of the original birth certificate of a child to the child's birth 15 parents upon request.

16 (3)(a) For adoptions finalized after October 1, 1993, the 17 department of health shall ((make available)) provide a noncertified 18 copy of the original birth certificate to ((the-adoptee-after-the 19 adoptee's-eighteenth-birthday-unless-the-birth-parent-has-filed-an

1 affidavit ofnondisclosure)) an adoptee eighteen years of age or older 2 upon_request, unless_the_birth_parent_has_filed_an_affidavit_of 3 nondisclosure before the effective date of this section or a contact 4 preference form that indicates he or she does not want the original 5 birth_certificate_released: PROVIDED,_That_the_affidavit_of 6 nondisclosure, the contact preference form, or both have not expired.

7 (b) For adoptions finalized on or before October 1, 1993, the department of health may not provide a noncertified copy of the 8 9 original birth certificate to the adoptee until after June 30, 2014. After June 30, 2014, the department of health shall provide a 10 noncertified copy of the original birth certificate to an adoptee 11 eighteen years of age or older upon request, unless the birth parent 12 13 has filed a contact preference form that indicates he or she does not want the original birth certificate released: PROVIDED, That the 14 contact preference form has not expired. 15

16 (c) An affidavit of nondisclosure expires upon the death of the 17 birth parent.

18 (4)(a) Regardless of whether a birth parent has filed an affidavit 19 of nondisclosure or when the adoption was finalized, a birth parent may 20 at any time complete a contact preference form stating his or her 21 preference about personal contact with the adoptee, which, if 22 available, must accompany an original birth certificate provided to an 23 adoptee under subsection (3) of this section.

24 (b) The contact preference form must include the following options: 25 (i) I would like to be contacted. I give the department of health 26 consent to provide the adoptee with a noncertified copy of his or her 27 original birth certificate;

28 (ii) I would like to be contacted only through a confidential 29 intermediary as described in RCW 26.33.343. I give the department of 30 health consent to provide the adoptee with a noncertified copy of his 31 or her original birth certificate;

- 32 (iii) I prefer not to be contacted and have completed the birth 33 parent updated medical history form. I give the department of health 34 consent to provide the adoptee with a noncertified copy of his or her 35 original birth certificate; and
- 36 (iv) I prefer not to be contacted and have completed the birth 37 parent updated medical history form. I do not want a noncertified copy 38 of the original birth certificate released to the adoptee.

(c) If the birth parent indicates he or she prefers not to be 1 2 contacted, personally identifying information on the contact preference form must be kept confidential and may not be released. 3 4 (d) <u>Nothing in this section precludes a birth parent from</u> subsequently filing another contact preference form to rescind the 5 previous contact preference form and state a different preference. 6 7 (e) A contact preference form expires upon the death of the birth 8 parent. 9 (5) If a birth parent files a contact preference form, the birth parent must also file an updated medical history form with the 10 department of health. Upon request of the adoptee, the department of 11 12 health must provide the adoptee with the updated medical history form 13 filed by the adoptee's birth parent. 14 (6) Both a completed contact preference form and birth parent updated medical history form are confidential and must be placed in the 15 16 adoptee's sealed file. 17 (7) If a birth parent files a contact preference form within six months after the first time an adoptee requests a copy of his or her 18 original birth certificate as provided in subsection (3) of this 19 20 section, the department of health must forward the contact preference 21 form and the birth parent updated medical history form to the address 22 of the adoptee. 23 (8) The department of health may charge a fee not to exceed twenty 24 dollars for providing a noncertified copy of a birth certificate to an 25 adoptee. 26 (9) The department of health must create the contact preference form and an updated medical history form. The contact preference form 27 must provide a method to ensure personally identifying information can 28 be kept confidential. The updated medical history form may not require 29 the birth parent to disclose any identifying information about the 30 31 birth parent. 32 (10) If the department of health does not provide an adoptee with a noncertified copy of the original birth certificate because a valid 33 affidavit of nondisclosure or contact preference form has been filed, 34 the adoptee may request, no more than once per year, that the 35 department of health attempt to determine if the birth parent is 36 37 deceased. Upon request of the adoptee, the department of health must make a reasonable effort to search public records that are accessible 38

- 1 and already available to the department of health to determine if the
- 2 <u>birth parent is deceased</u>. The <u>department of health may charge the</u>
- 3 adoptee a reasonable fee to cover the cost of conducting a search.
