- 1 AN ACT Relating to membership on city disability boards; and 2 amending RCW 41.26.110.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 4 **Sec. 1.** RCW 41.26.110 and 2005 c 66 s 1 are each amended to read 5 as follows:
 - (1) All claims for disability shall be acted upon and either approved or disapproved by either type of disability board authorized to be created in this section.
- (a) Each city having a population of twenty thousand or more shall 9 10 establish a disability board having jurisdiction over all members employed by those cities and composed of the following five members: 11 12 Two members of the city legislative body to be appointed by the mayor; one active or retired firefighter employed by or retired from the city 13 14 to be elected by the firefighters employed by or retired from the city who are subject to the jurisdiction of the board; one active or retired 15 law enforcement officer employed by or retired from the city to be 16 elected by the law enforcement officers employed by or retired from the 17 city who are subject to the jurisdiction of the board; and one member 18 19 from the public at large who resides within the city to be appointed by

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the other four members designated in this subsection. Only those 1 2 active or retired firefighters and law enforcement officers who are subject to the jurisdiction of the board have the right to elect under 3 this section. All firefighters and law enforcement officers employed 4 by or retired from the city are eligible for election. Each of the 5 elected members shall serve a two year term. If there are either no 6 firefighters or law enforcement officers under the jurisdiction of the 7 board eligible to vote, a second eligible employee representative shall 8 be elected by the law enforcement officers or firefighters eligible to 9 The members appointed pursuant to this subsection shall serve 10 for two year terms: PROVIDED, That cities of the first class only, 11 12 shall retain existing ((firemen's)) firefighters' pension boards 13 established pursuant to RCW 41.16.020 and existing boards of trustees 14 of the relief and pension fund of the police department as established pursuant to RCW 41.20.010 which such boards shall have authority to act 15 upon and approve or disapprove claims for disability by firefighters or 16 17 enforcement officers as provided under the Washington 18 enforcement officers' and firefighters' retirement system act.

Each county shall establish a disability board having jurisdiction over all members employed by or retired from an employer within the county and not employed by a city in which a disability board is established. The county disability board so created shall be composed of five members to be chosen as follows: One member of the legislative body of the county to be appointed by the county legislative body; one member of a city or town legislative body located within the county which does not contain a city disability board established pursuant to ((subsection (1)))(a) of this subsection to be chosen by a majority of the mayors of such cities and towns within the county which does not contain a city disability board; one active firefighter or retired firefighter employed by or retired from an employer within the county to be elected by the firefighters employed or retired from an employer within the county who are not employed by or retired from a city in which a disability board is established and who are subject to the jurisdiction of that board; one law enforcement officer or retired law enforcement officer employed by or retired from an employer within the county to be elected by the law enforcement officers employed in or retired from an employer within the county who are not employed by or retired from a city in which a disability board

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is established and who are subject to the jurisdiction of that board; 1 2 and one member from the public at large who resides within the county but does not reside within a city in which a city disability board is 3 established, to be appointed by the other four members designated in 4 this subsection. However, in counties with a population less than 5 sixty thousand, the member of the disability board appointed by a 6 7 majority of the mayors of the cities and towns within the county that do not contain a city disability board must be a resident of one of the 8 cities and towns but need not be a member of a city or town legislative 9 body. Only those active or retired firefighters and law enforcement 10 officers who are subject to the jurisdiction of the board have the 11 12 right to elect under this section. All firefighters 13 enforcement officers employed by or retired from an employer within the 14 county who are not employed by or retired from a city in which a disability board is established are eliqible for election. All members 15 appointed or elected pursuant to this subsection shall serve for two 16 17 year terms. If there are no firefighters under the jurisdiction of the board eligible to vote, a second eligible employee representative shall 18 be elected by the law enforcement officers eliqible to vote. If there 19 are no law enforcement officers under the jurisdiction of the board 20 21 eligible to vote, a second eligible representative shall be elected by 22 the firefighters eligible to vote.

- (2) The members of both the county and city disability boards shall not receive compensation for their service upon the boards but the members shall be reimbursed by their respective county or city for all expenses incidental to such service as to the amount authorized by law.
- (3) The disability boards authorized for establishment by this section shall perform all functions, exercise all powers, and make all such determinations as specified in this chapter.
