1 AN ACT Relating to the rights of higher education students involved 2 in military service; and amending RCW 28B.10.270.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

4 Sec. 1. RCW 28B.10.270 and 2004 c 161 s 1 are each amended to read 5 as follows:

6 (1) A member of the Washington national guard or any other military 7 reserve component who is a student at an institution of higher 8 education and who is ordered for a period exceeding thirty days to 9 either active state service, as defined in RCW 38.04.010, or to federal 10 active military service has the following rights:

11 (a) With regard to courses in which the person is enrolled, the 12 person may:

(i) Withdraw from one or more courses for which tuition and fees have been paid that are attributable to the courses. The tuition and fees must be credited to the person's account at the institution. Any refunds are subject to the requirements of the state or federal financial aid programs of origination. In such a case, the student shall not receive credit for the courses and shall not receive a 1 failing grade, an incomplete, or other negative annotation on the 2 student's record, and the student's grade point average shall not be 3 altered or affected in any manner because of action under this item;

4 (ii) Be given a grade of incomplete and be allowed to complete the
5 course upon release from active duty under the institution's standard
6 practice for completion of incompletes; or

(iii) Continue and complete the course for full credit. Class 7 sessions the student misses due to performance of state or federal 8 active military service must be counted as excused absences and must 9 not be used in any way to adversely impact the student's grade or 10 standing in the class. Any student who selects this option is not, 11 12 however, automatically excused from completing assignments due during 13 the period the student is performing state or federal active military 14 service. A letter grade or a grade of pass must only be awarded if, in the opinion of the faculty member teaching the course, the student has 15 completed sufficient work and has demonstrated sufficient progress 16 17 toward meeting course requirements to justify the grade;

(b) To receive a refund of amounts paid for room, board, and fees attributable to the time period during which the student was serving in state or federal active military service and did not use the facilities or services for which the amounts were paid. Any refund of room, board, and fees is subject to the requirements of the state or federal financial aid programs of origination; and

(c) If the student chooses to withdraw, the student has the right to be readmitted and enrolled as a student at the institution, without penalty or redetermination of admission eligibility, within one year following release from the state or federal active military service.

(2)(a) <u>A member of the Washington national guard or any other</u> 28 military reserve or guard component who is a student at an institution 29 of higher education and who is ordered for a period of thirty days or 30 less to either active or inactive state or federal service and as a 31 result_of_that_service_or_follow-up_medical_treatment_for_injury 32 <u>incurred_during_that_service_misses_any_class,_test,_examination,</u> 33 laboratory, or class day on which a written or oral assignment is due, 34 35 or other event upon which a course grade or evaluation is based, is 36 entitled to make up the class, test, examination, laboratory, 37 presentation, or event without prejudice to the final course grade or 1 evaluation. The makeup must be scheduled after the member's return
2 from service and after a reasonable time for the student to prepare for
3 the test, examination, laboratory, presentation, or event.

(b) Class sessions a student misses due to performance of state or
federal active or inactive military service must be counted as excused
absences and may not be used in any way to adversely impact the
student's grade or standing in class.

(c) If the faculty member teaching the course determines that the 8 student has completed sufficient work and has demonstrated sufficient 9 progress toward meeting course requirements to justify the grade 10 without making up the class, test, examination, presentation, or other 11 event, the grade may be awarded without the makeup, but the missed 12 13 class, test, examination, laboratory, class day, presentation, or other 14 event must not be used in any way to adversely impact the student's grade or standing in the class. 15

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(3) The protections in this section may be invoked as follows:

17 (a) The person, or an appropriate officer from the military 18 organization in which the person will be serving, must give written 19 notice that the person is being, or has been, ordered to qualifying 20 service; and

(b) Upon written request from the institution, the person shallprovide written verification of service.

23 (((3))) <u>(4)</u> This section provides minimum protections for students.
24 Nothing in this section prevents institutions of higher education from
25 providing additional options or protections to students who are ordered
26 to state or federal active military service.
