- 7 (1) A tenant screening service provider may not (a) disclose a tenant's, applicant's, or household member's status as a victim of
- 9 <u>domestic_violence, sexual_assault, or_stalking, or_(b)_knowingly</u>
- 10 <u>disclose that a tenant, applicant, or household member has previously</u>
- 11 <u>terminated a rental agreement under RCW 59.18.575.</u>
- (2) A landlord may not terminate a tenancy, fail to renew a tenancy, or refuse to enter into a rental agreement based on the tenant's or applicant's or a household member's status as a victim of domestic violence, sexual assault, or stalking, or based on the tenant
- or applicant having terminated a rental agreement under RCW 59.18.575.
- 17 $((\frac{(2)}{2}))$ (3) A landlord who refuses to enter into a rental agreement 18 in violation of <u>subsection (2) of</u> this section may be liable to the

tenant or applicant in a civil action for damages sustained by the tenant or applicant. The prevailing party may also recover court costs and reasonable attorneys' fees.

 $((\frac{3}{1}))$ (4) It is a defense to an unlawful detainer action under chapter 59.12 RCW that the action to remove the tenant and recover possession of the premises is in violation of subsection $((\frac{1}{1}))$ (2) of this section.

(((4))) <u>(5)</u> This section does not prohibit adverse housing decisions based upon other lawful factors within the landlord's knowledge <u>or prohibit volunteer disclosure by an applicant of any victim circumstances.</u>

NEW SECTION. Sec. 2. This act takes effect January 1, 2014.
