**HB 1881** by Representative Dahlquist  
Narrowing the definition of resident student for holders of certain nonimmigrant status visas.  
Revises the definition of "resident student" for purposes of nonimmigrant status visas.

Requires the department of health to establish a work group to review and make recommendations on the practice of sexual orientation change efforts on persons under eighteen years of age.

Restoring some of the nursing facility payment methodology changes made during 2011.

Revises nursing facility payment methodology provisions to restore some of the changes made in chapter 7, Laws of 2011 1st sp. sess. (ESSB 5581).

Concerning the recoverable costs of the department of agriculture under chapter 16.36 RCW.

Regarding industrial hemp.

Attempts to reassert the original meaning of the commerce clause in the United States Constitution over wide areas of policy and effectively nullify federal laws and regulations that violate such limitations by regulating commerce and other activities that are solely intrastate.

Permits the development of an industrial hemp industry and ensures that production of industrial hemp is in compliance with state law.

Requires the director of the department of agriculture to charge a fee for each license granted to an industrial hemp grower.

Authorizes Washington State University to undertake research of industrial hemp production in the state after receiving a license to grow hemp.

Creates the industrial hemp account.

Concerning the fruit and vegetable district fund.

Modifying sales tax exemptions for working families.

Repeals the nonresident sales tax exemption.

Modifies the working families' sales tax exemption.

Requiring the display of the national league of families' POW/MIA flag on certain days.

Requires certain public entities to also display the national league of families' POW/MIA flag on Former Prisoners of War Recognition Day on April 9th and on Pearl Harbor Remembrance Day on December 7th.

Requires scientific research studies relating to negative and positive effects of evolving shellfish aquaculture techniques and practices on the state's economy and marine ecosystems to be coordinated with any research efforts by the sea grant and other university programs related to ocean acidification.

Changes the name of the shellfish aquaculture regulatory committee to the shellfish aquaculture committee.

Changes the name of the geoduck aquaculture research account to the shellfish aquaculture research account.

Requires a wireless telecommunications provider to provide call location information concerning the telecommunications device of a user when requested by a law enforcement agency for the purpose of responding to a

call for emergency services or in an emergency situation that involves the risk of death or serious physical harm.

Authorizes certain contribution paying base year employers to receive relief of charges for benefits if the charges result from payment to an individual who continues to be employed on a regularly scheduled permanent part-time basis by a base year employer and who qualified for two consecutive unemployment claims where wages were attributable to at least one employer who employed the individual in both base years.

Requires the department of social and health services or the supervising agency to, absent good cause, follow the wishes of a parent regarding placement of a child.

Requires participation of state agencies with regulatory requirements that impact the project's industry sector.

Improving relationships between agricultural producers and state regulatory staff.

Requires the state conservation commission to initiate a state forum that includes persons designated by the directors of the departments of ecology, agriculture, natural resources, and fish and wildlife, and agricultural producers nominated to the commission by state and regional agricultural organizations to initiate and test processes that seek to improve mutual understandings and build improved working relationships between agricultural producers and state regulatory personnel.

Expires July 1, 2018.

Revises the definition of "eligible renewable resource," for purposes of the energy independence act, to include electricity generated from a hydroelectric generation project with a generating capacity of thirty megawatts or less that meets certain criteria.

Permitting conservation districts to use electronic deposits for employee pay and compensation.

Authorizes conservation districts to disburse funds in payment of salaries, wages, and other approved financial reimbursement to an employee or contractor of the district to any financial institution.

Requires the state institute for public policy to develop a standardized static risk assessment instrument that assesses risk to the community and, if feasible, risk of rehospitalization for adults involuntarily committed for civil treatment and forensic mental health evaluations.

Concerning local option transportation revenue.

Authorizes certain governing bodies of public transportation benefit areas, for the sole purpose of providing funds for the operation, maintenance, or capital needs of public transportation systems, to submit an authorizing proposition to the voters and, if approved, impose a local motor vehicle excise tax of up to one percent annually on the value of every motor vehicle registered to a person residing within the county.

**SB 5778** by Senators Kohl-Welles, Keiser, Kline, Nelson, Murray, and Frockt

Allowing certain county legislative authorities to impose a sales and use tax by ordinance.

Authorizes the legislative authority of certain counties to opt to impose a sales and use tax by ordinance that clearly states the purpose for which the proposed sales and use tax will be used.

Requires the department of licensing to: (1) Adopt rules regarding distance or online learning in the areas of cosmetology, manicuring, barbering, esthetics, and instructor-training; and

(2) Provide an evaluation review to the committees of the legislature that oversee the licensing of those professions.
