House Bills

HB 2018 by Representative Hunter

Regarding additional contribution rates for employers of the Washington state retirement systems.

Addresses additional contribution rates for contributions made after the date the service is rendered for individual employers of the state retirement systems.

Mar 25 First reading, referred to Appropriations (Not Officially read and referred until adoption of Introduction report). Scheduled for public hearing in the House Committee on Appropriations at 3:30 PM. (Subject to change)

HB 2019 by Representatives Tharinger, Haler, Hunt, Pollet, Morrell, and Goodman

Concerning the sales and distribution of spirits by distributors, restaurants, former contract liquor stores, and former state store auction buyers.

Addresses the sales and distribution of spirits by distributors, restaurants, former contract liquor stores, and former state store auction buyers.

-- 2013 REGULAR SESSION --

Mar 25 First reading, referred to Government Accountability & Oversight (Not Officially read and referred until adoption of Introduction report).

Creates a Spanish and Chinese language instruction pilot program in which a maximum of two school districts may participate.

Requires each school district to provide a world language program in elementary schools that provides instruction in Spanish and a Chinese language.

Mar 25 First reading, referred to Early Learning & K-12 Education.
