House Bills

HB 1902-S by House Committee on Transportation (originally sponsored by Representatives Holy, Shea, Short, Clibborn, Schmick, Ormsby, Fagan, Crouse, Riccelli, Blake, and Kristiansen)

Creating intermittent-use trailer license plates.

(DIGEST OF PROPOSED 1ST SUBSTITUTE)

Allows a registered owner to apply to the department of licensing, county auditor or other agent, or subagent appointed by the director of the department of licensing for an intermittent-use trailer license plate for an intermittent-use trailer.

Feb 26 Public hearing in the House Committee on Transportation at 1:30 PM.

Apr 2 TR - Majority; 1st substitute bill be substituted, do pass.

Executive action taken in the House Committee on Transportation at 3:30 PM.

Apr 3 Passed to Rules Committee for second reading.

Senate Bills

SB 5902 by Senators Padden and Kline

Relating to driving under the influence.

Introduced by title and introductory section only, relating to driving under the influence.

Apr 8 First reading, referred to Law & Justice.

Apr 11 Scheduled for public hearing in the Senate Committee on Law & Justice at 8:00 AM. (Subject to change)

SB 5903 by Senator Braun

Concerning the family and medical leave insurance act.

Repeals the family and medical leave insurance act.

-- 2013 REGULAR SESSION --

Apr 9 First reading, referred to Ways & Means.

SB 5904 by Senators Hill, Hargrove, Litzow, and Billig

Concerning high quality early learning.

Requires the department of early learning: (1) During the 2013-2015 biennium, to increase enrollments in the early learning program by ten percent from the 2011-2013 biennium enrollments;

(2) To continue to review and evaluate the contracts used to provide the early learning program;

(3) Along with the office of financial management, to develop an implementation plan for expanding the early learning program; and

(4) To deliver the implementation plan to the appropriate committees of the legislature.

Requires the state institute for public policy, during the 2013-2015 biennium, to conduct a comprehensive retrospective outcome evaluation and return on investment analysis of the early childhood program and submit a report to the appropriate committees of the legislature.
