House Bills

HB 1986-S by House Committee on Transportation (originally sponsored by Representatives O'Ban, Rodne, Magendanz, Zeiger, Kristiansen, Klippert, and Hayes)

Requiring the reporting of highway construction project errors.

(DIGEST OF PROPOSED 1ST SUBSTITUTE)

Requires the department of transportation to submit a report to the transportation committees of the legislature detailing engineering errors on highway construction projects resulting in project cost increases in excess of five hundred thousand dollars.

Requires submission of an initial report of an engineering error within thirty days of the engineering error occurring and a full report within ninety days of the engineering error occurring.

Apr 2 TR - Majority; 1st substitute bill be substituted, do pass.

Minority; do not pass.

Executive action taken in the House Committee on Transportation at 3:30 PM.

Apr 3 Passed to Rules Committee for second reading.

HB 2028 by Representatives Kochmar, Orwall, Hayes, and Hargrove

Concerning marijuana in negligent driving provisions. Includes marijuana in negligent driving provisions.

Apr 11 First reading, referred to Public Safety (Not Officially read and referred until adoption of Introduction report).

HB 2029 by Representative Morris

Eliminating economic development-related agencies, boards, and commissions.

Eliminates the Washington state economic development commission and the Washington tourism commission.

Abolishes innovate Washington and transfers its powers, duties, and functions to the department of commerce.

Eliminates the Washington global health technologies and product development competitiveness program's board of directors and requires the life sciences discovery fund authority to administer or contract with a qualified nonprofit organization to administer the Washington global health technologies and product development competitiveness program.

Apr 12 First reading, referred to Appropriations (Not Officially read and referred until adoption of Introduction report).

Senate Bills

SB 5908 by Senators Kohl-Welles, Nelson, Hargrove, Keiser, Hobbs, Frockt, and Kline

Concerning property tax refunds. Modifies property tax refund provisions.
