## HOUSE BILL 1612

1 AN ACT Relating to the payment of workers' compensation benefits 2 by self-insured employers pending appeal; and amending RCW 51.48.017.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

4 Sec. 1. RCW 51.48.017 and 2010 c 8 s 14011 are each amended to 5 read as follows:

6 (1) Except as provided in subsection (2) of this section, if a 7 self-insurer unreasonably delays or refuses to pay benefits as they become due there shall be paid by the self-insurer upon order of the 8 director an additional amount equal to five hundred dollars or 9 10 twenty-five percent of the amount then due, whichever is greater, 11 which shall accrue for the benefit of the claimant and shall be paid to him or her with the benefits which may be assessed under this 12 title. The director shall issue an order determining whether there 13 was an unreasonable delay or refusal to pay benefits within thirty 14 days upon the request of the claimant. Such an order shall conform to 15 16 the requirements of RCW 51.52.050.

17 (2)(a) A self-insurer that unreasonably delays or refuses to pay 18 benefits pending an appeal to the board, shall, upon order of the 19 director, pay an additional amount as follows:

20 <u>(i) For the self-insurer's first violation, one thousand dollars</u> 21 <u>or twenty-five percent of the amount then due, whichever is greater;</u> 1 (ii) For the second violation within twenty-four months of the 2 first violation, one thousand dollars or thirty-five percent of the 3 amount then due, whichever is greater;

4 (iii) For the third violation within twenty-four months of the
5 first violation, one thousand dollars or forty-five percent of the
6 amount then due, whichever is greater; and

7 (iv) Thereafter, for every subsequent violation within twenty-8 four months of the first violation, the percentage of the amount due 9 is increased by an additional ten percent per violation, and the 10 self-insurer shall pay an amount equal to one thousand dollars or the 11 escalated percentage of the amount then due, whichever is greater.

12 (b) If the self-insurer has no second violation within twenty-13 four months of a first violation, then a subsequent violation shall 14 be considered a first violation.

15 (c) The additional amounts accrue for the benefit of the claimant 16 and must be paid to him or her with the benefits that may be assessed 17 under this title. The director shall issue an order determining 18 whether there was an unreasonable delay or refusal to pay benefits 19 within thirty days upon the request of the claimant. Such an order 20 must conform to the requirements of RCW 51.52.050.

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
