## HOUSE BILL 2687

State of Washington 64th Legislature 2016 Regular Session

By Representatives Van De Wege, Sells, S. Hunt, Stanford, and Goodman Read first time 01/18/16. Referred to Committee on Health Care & Wellness.

AN ACT Relating to parity in coverage for hearing disabilities; adding a new section to chapter 48.43 RCW; adding a new section to chapter 41.05 RCW; adding a new section to chapter 74.09 RCW; and creating new sections.

## 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

6 NEW SECTION. Sec. 1. The legislature finds that coverage for 7 hearing disabilities is commonly excluded from insurance coverage. This creates a disincentive for the hearing-impaired to 8 treatment given that costs would be borne entirely out-of-pocket and 9 10 be paid in addition to rising deductibles for health insurance 11 coverage already required by the patient protection and affordable care act, P.L. 111-148 (2010) and as amended by the health care and 12 education reconciliation act, P.L. 111-152 (2010). 13

The legislature recognizes that, according to the national institute on deafness and other communication disorders, fewer than one-fifth of Americans between the ages of twenty and sixty-nine who could benefit from using hearing aids have ever used them. The legislature further finds that twenty states have addressed the cost barrier issue by requiring coverage for hearing disabilities. Therefore, the legislature intends to require that insurance coverage be at parity for hearing disability services, which means this

- 1 coverage, subject to reasonable caps on costs for hearing

- 6 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 3.** A new section is added to chapter 48.43 7 RCW to read as follows:
- (1) Each group contract for comprehensive health care services 8 9 which is entered into, or renewed on or after January 1, 2017, shall include coverage for hearing aids for children under the age of 10 11 eighteen when medically necessary. Coverage must include a new 12 hearing aid every five years, a new hearing aid when alterations to the existing hearing aid cannot meet the needs of the child, and 13 14 services and supplies such as the initial assessment, fitting, 15 adjustment, and auditory training.
  - (2) Each group contract for comprehensive health care services which is entered into, or renewed on or after January 1, 2017, shall offer optional coverage for hearing aids for adults. If the employer chooses to add this option, the health plan must provide hearing aid coverage of no less than one thousand four hundred dollars per ear every three years for adults.
- 22 (3) For purposes of this section, "hearing aid" or "hearing 23 instrument" has the same meaning as in RCW 18.35.010(12).
- 24 (4) The hearing aid must be prescribed by a licensed audiologist 25 and dispensed by a licensed audiologist or hearing instrument 26 specialist.
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 4. A new section is added to chapter 41.05 RCW to read as follows:
- (1) A health plan offered to employees and their covered 29 dependents under this chapter issued or renewed on or after January 30 1, 2017, shall include coverage for hearing aids for children under 31 32 the age of eighteen when medically necessary. Coverage must include a 33 new hearing aid every five years, a new hearing aid when alterations 34 to the existing hearing aid cannot meet the needs of the child, and 35 services and supplies such as the initial assessment, fitting, 36 adjustment, and auditory training.

- 3 (3) The hearing aid must be prescribed by a licensed audiologist 4 and dispensed by a licensed audiologist or hearing instrument 5 specialist.
- 6 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 5.** A new section is added to chapter 74.09 7 RCW to read as follows:
- (1) The medical assistance coverage offered to children under 8 this chapter issued or renewed on or after January 1, 2017, shall 9 10 include coverage for hearing aids for children under the age of twenty when medically necessary. Coverage must include a new hearing 11 aid every five years, a new hearing aid when alterations to the 12 existing hearing aid cannot meet the needs of the child, and services 13 and supplies such as the initial assessment, fitting, adjustment, and 14 15 auditory training.
- 16 (2) For purposes of this section, "hearing aid" or "hearing 17 instrument" has the same meaning as in RCW 18.35.010(12).
- 18 (3) The hearing aid must be prescribed by a licensed audiologist 19 and dispensed by a licensed audiologist or hearing instrument 20 specialist.
