- 1 AN ACT Relating to state route number 26; creating new sections;
- 2 and providing an effective date.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 4 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 1.** The legislature finds that state route
- 5 number 26 is an important corridor that connects state route number
- 6 90 and state route number 195. The current roadway is two lanes
- 7 through much of its length and often inadequate for the traveling
- 8 public, especially when there are significant events at the
- 9 Washington State University campus in Pullman.
- 10 NEW SECTION. Sec. 2. To address the needs on the state route
- 11 number 26 corridor, the legislature directs the department of
- 12 transportation to undertake a feasibility study within its existing
- 13 resources. The study must identify improvements that will increase
- 14 safety and mobility for all users of the corridor, and must consider
- 15 the feasibility of ultimately expanding the state route number 26
- 16 roadway to four lanes between Vantage and Pullman. In preparing the
- 17 study, the department must consult with representatives from cities
- 18 and towns along the state route number 26 corridor as well as
- 19 Washington State University. The results of the feasibility study

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- 1 must be submitted to the transportation committees of the legislature
- 2 by June 30, 2017.
- 3 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 3.** This act takes effect July 1, 2016.

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
