## SENATE BILL 5117

- 1 AN ACT Relating to development of a bistate transportation
- 2 project; adding a new section to chapter 47.28 RCW; and creating a
- 3 new section.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 5 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 1.** The development of a bistate megaproject
- 6 takes years of hard work and difficult decisions. Once a megaproject
- 7 has reached the stage in its development when the federal government
- 8 has issued a record of decision, the megaproject must move forward.
- 9 To allow otherwise is to waste tens of millions of dollars of
- 10 taxpayer money, destroy bistate relationships and trust, and stall
- 11 economic growth and productivity in the entire region.
- 12 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 2.** A new section is added to chapter 47.28
- 13 RCW to read as follows:
- 14 (1) As used in this section, "bistate megaproject" means a
- 15 highway construction project valued at five hundred million dollars
- 16 or more that extends across the border between Washington and another
- 17 state.
- 18 (2) Prior to working with another state on an environmental
- 19 impact statement that complies with the national environmental policy
- 20 act on a bistate megaproject, the department must enter into a

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1 contract with the department that manages transportation construction in the neighboring state in which the megaproject will be located. 2 The terms of the contract must, at a minimum, contain the following 3 provision: A state whose legislative body fails to adopt a financing 4 plan that identifies the sources of funding to fully complete the 5 6 megaproject within eight years of the date of receipt of the record of decision must be held responsible for: (a) Reimbursing all of the 7 neighboring state's expenditures on the project to date, (b) any 8 federal funds expended in the development of the project to date, and 9 (c) any other liquidated damages as negotiated and agreed to by the 10 11 states.

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
