- AN ACT Relating to preservation of DNA work product; and adding a new chapter to Title 5 RCW.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 1. (1) In any felony case involving a violent 4 or sex offense as defined in RCW 9.94A.030, a governmental entity 5 6 shall preserve any DNA work product that has been secured connection with the criminal case. The DNA work product must be 7 maintained throughout the length of the sentence, including any 8 period of community custody extending through final discharge, or 9 10 throughout the period of the statute of limitations pursuant to RCW 11 9A.04.080, whichever comes later.
 - (2) For purposes of this section:
- 13 (a) "DNA work product":

- 14 (i) Means any material catalogued on a microscope slide, swab, in a test tube, cutting, DNA extract, or another, similar retention 15 16 method used to isolate potential biological evidence that has been 17 collected by law enforcement as part of an investigation and prepared scientific analysis, whether or not it is 18 submitted for scientific analysis, including any product generated during the 19 process of scientific analysis of such material, and derived from: 20
- 21 (A) The contents of a sexual assault examination kit;

- 1 (B) Blood;
- 2 (C) Semen;
- 3 (D) Hair;
- 4 (E) Saliva;
- 5 (F) Skin tissue;
- 6 (G) Fingerprints;
- 7 (H) Bones;
- 8 (I) Teeth; or
- 9 (J) Any other identifiable human biological material or physical 10 evidence; and
- (ii) Only includes products submitted by the investigating general law enforcement agency and does not include any products generated by a crime laboratory during the process of scientific analysis of such material.
- 15 (b) "Governmental entity" means any general law enforcement 16 agency or any person or organization officially acting on behalf of 17 the state or any political subdivision of the state involved in the 18 collection, examination, tracking, packaging, storing, or disposition 19 of biological material collected in connection with a criminal 20 investigation relating to a felony offense.
- 21 (3) If a court finds that DNA work product was destroyed 22 intentionally to violate this section, the court may impose 23 appropriate sanctions. The court may not order the reversal of a 24 conviction under this section on the sole grounds that the DNA work 25 product is no longer available.
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 2. Section 1 of this act constitutes a new chapter in Title 5 RCW.
