- AN ACT Relating to certification of adjunct faculty as common 1
- 2 school substitute teachers; and amending RCW 28A.410.010.
- BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON: 3
- RCW 28A.410.010 and 2014 c 50 s 2 are each amended to 4 Sec. 1. 5 read as follows:
 - (1)(a) The Washington professional educator standards board shall establish, publish, and enforce rules determining eligibility for and certification of personnel employed in the common schools of this state, including certification for emergency or temporary, substitute or provisional duty and under such certificates or permits as the board shall deem proper or as otherwise prescribed by law.
- (b)(i) By December 1, 2015, the board must amend or adopt rules 12 that provide for the issuance of the certification necessary to serve 13 14 as substitute teachers, other than emergency substitute certification, to adjunct faculty currently employed in institutions 15 16 of higher education, as defined in RCW 28B.07.020 and 28B.10.016, who
- 17 meet the following criteria:
- (A) A minimum of a master's degree from a regionally accredited 18 institution of higher education; 19
- (B) Three or more years of demonstrated successful experience 20 21 instructing students; and

- (ii) Individuals who meet the criteria established in (b)(i) of this subsection are not required to have completed an approved teacher preparation program or to hold or have held a regular teaching certificate.
- (c) The rules shall require that the initial application for 7 certification shall require a record check of the applicant through 8 Washington state patrol criminal identification system and 9 10 through the federal bureau of investigation at the applicant's expense. The record check shall include a fingerprint check using a 11 12 complete Washington state criminal identification fingerprint card. An individual who holds a valid portable background check clearance 13 card issued by the department of early learning consistent with RCW 14 43.215.215 is exempt from the office of the superintendent of public 15 16 instruction fingerprint background check if the individual provides a 17 true and accurate copy of his or her Washington state patrol and federal bureau of investigation background report results to the 18 19 office of the superintendent of public instruction. The superintendent of public instruction may waive the record check for 20 21 any applicant who has had a record check within the two years before 22 application. The rules shall permit a holder of a lapsed certificate but not a revoked or suspended certificate to be employed on a 23 conditional basis by a school district with the requirement that the 24 25 holder must complete any certificate renewal requirements established 26 by the state board of education within two years of 27 reemployment.
 - $((\frac{b}{b}))$ (d) In establishing rules pertaining to the qualifications of instructors of American sign language the board shall consult with the national association of the deaf, "sign instructors guidance network" (s.i.g.n.), and the Washington state association of the deaf for evaluation and certification of sign language instructors.
 - $((\frac{c}{c}))$ <u>(e)</u> The board shall develop rules consistent with RCW 18.340.020 for the certification of spouses of military personnel.
- 36 (2) The superintendent of public instruction shall act as the 37 administrator of any such rules and have the power to issue any
