1 AN ACT Relating to a tuition and fees exemption for children and 2 surviving spouses of certain highway workers; and amending RCW 3 28B.15.380.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

5 Sec. 1. RCW 28B.15.380 and 2012 c 229 s 703 are each amended to 6 read as follows:

7 Subject to the limitations of RCW 28B.15.910, the governing 8 boards of the state universities, the regional universities, and The 9 Evergreen State College shall exempt the following students from the 10 payment of all tuition fees and services and activities fees:

11 (1) Children of any law enforcement officer as defined in chapter 12 41.26 RCW, firefighter as defined in chapter 41.26 or 41.24 RCW, 13 highway worker, or Washington state patrol officer who lost his or 14 her life or became totally disabled in the line of duty while 15 employed by any public law enforcement agency or full-time or volunteer fire department in this state, or was a highway worker 16 while employed by a transportation agency: PROVIDED, 17 That such persons may receive the exemption only if they begin their course of 18 study at a state-supported college or university within ten years of 19 20 their graduation from high school; and

1 (2) Surviving spouses of any law enforcement officer as defined 2 in chapter 41.26 RCW, firefighter as defined in chapter 41.26 or 3 41.24 RCW, <u>highway worker</u>, or Washington state patrol officer who 4 lost his or her life or became totally disabled in the line of duty 5 while employed by any public law enforcement agency or full\_time or 6 volunteer fire department in this state, or was a highway worker 7 while employed by a transportation agency.

8 (3) The governing boards of the state universities, the regional 9 universities, and The Evergreen State College shall report to the 10 education data center on the annual cost of tuition fees and services 11 and activities fees waived for surviving spouses and children under 12 this section. The education data center shall consolidate the reports 13 of the waived fees and annually report to the appropriate fiscal and 14 policy committees of the legislature.

(4) As used in this section, "transportation agency" means any 15 agency, department, or division of a municipal corporation, political 16 17 subdivision, or other unit of local government in this state, and any agency, department, or division of state government, having as its 18 primary function the construction and maintenance of the highways and 19 roads within the state of Washington. Such an agency, department, or 20 division is distinguished from a transit agency having as one of its 21 functions the highway maintenance, including but not limited to the 22 23 state department of transportation. A transportation agency under this section does not include a government contractor. 24
