1 AN ACT Relating to creating a pilot program for the supervision
2 of offenders who commit motor vehicle-related and property offenses;
3 adding a new section to chapter 9.94A RCW; and providing an
4 expiration date.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

6 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 1.** A new section is added to chapter 9.94A
7 RCW to read as follows:

8 (1) Subject to the availability of amounts appropriated for this
9 purpose, a pilot program is established for the supervision of
10 offenders convicted of felonies relating to the theft or taking of a
11 motor vehicle.

12 (2) Notwithstanding the provisions of RCW 9.94A.701, until June
13 30, 2021, a participating court may sentence an offender to community
14 custody for a term of one year when the court sentences the person to
15 the custody of the department for theft of a motor vehicle (RCW
16 9A.56.065), possession of a stolen vehicle (RCW 9A.56.068), taking a
17 motor vehicle without permission in the first degree (RCW 9A.56.070),
18 taking a motor vehicle without permission in the second degree (RCW
19 9A.56.075), or a crime against property with a prior conviction for
20 one of the preceding motor vehicle crimes.

1 (3) Notwithstanding the provisions of RCW 9.94A.501, the
2 department shall supervise any offender sentenced to community
3 custody pursuant to subsection (2) of this section.

4 (4) No later than November 1, 2022, the department must submit a
5 report to the governor and the appropriate committees of the
6 legislature analyzing the effectiveness of supervision in reducing
7 recidivism among offenders committing felonies relating to the theft
8 or taking of a motor vehicle. The department shall consult with the
9 Washington state institute for public policy in guiding its data
10 tracking efforts and preparing the report.

11 (5) For purposes of this section, "participating court" means the
12 Spokane county superior court or Federal Way municipal court,
13 provided Spokane county or the city of Federal Way have agreed with
14 the department to participate in the pilot program.

15 (6) This section expires December 31, 2022.
