1 AN ACT Relating to recommendations of the sunshine committee;
2 amending RCW 42.56.250; reenacting and amending RCW 42.56.230 and
3 42.56.270; adding a new section to chapter 42.56 RCW; and repealing
4 RCW 39.26.030.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

6 **Sec. 1.** RCW 42.56.230 and 2015 c 224 s 2 and 2015 c 47 s 1 are
7 each reenacted and amended to read as follows:

8 The following personal information is exempt from public
9 inspection and copying under this chapter, unless the agency has
10 received consent for disclosure from the subject of the information
11 or, in the case of a child, from the child's parent or guardian:

12 (1) Personal information in any files maintained for students in
13 public schools, patients or clients of public institutions or public
14 health agencies, or welfare recipients;

15 (2)(a) Personal information:

16 (i) For a child enrolled in licensed child care in any files
17 maintained by the department of early learning;

18 (ii) For a child enrolled in a public or nonprofit program
19 serving or pertaining to children, adolescents, or students,
20 including but not limited to early learning or child care services,

1 parks and recreation programs, youth development programs, and after-
2 school programs; or

3 (iii) For the family members or guardians of a child who is
4 subject to the exemption under this subsection (2) if the family
5 member or guardian has the same last name (~~(of [as])~~) as the child or
6 if the family member or guardian resides at the same address (~~(of~~
7 ~~[as])~~) as the child and disclosure of the family member's or
8 guardian's information would result in disclosure of the personal
9 information exempted under (a)(i) and (ii) of this subsection.

10 (b) Emergency contact information under this subsection (2) may
11 be provided to appropriate authorities and medical personnel for the
12 purpose of treating the individual during an emergency situation;

13 (3) Personal information in files maintained for employees,
14 appointees, or elected officials of any public agency to the extent
15 that disclosure would violate their right to privacy;

16 (4) Information required of any taxpayer in connection with the
17 assessment or collection of any tax if the disclosure of the
18 information to other persons would: (a) Be prohibited to such persons
19 by RCW 84.08.210, 82.32.330, 84.40.020, 84.40.340, or any ordinance
20 authorized under RCW 35.102.145; or (b) violate the taxpayer's right
21 to privacy or result in unfair competitive disadvantage to the
22 taxpayer;

23 (5) Credit card numbers, debit card numbers, electronic check
24 numbers, card expiration dates, or bank or other financial
25 information as defined in RCW 9.35.005 including social security
26 numbers, except when disclosure is expressly required by or governed
27 by other law;

28 (6) Personal and financial information related to a small loan or
29 any system of authorizing a small loan in RCW 31.45.093;

30 (7)(a) Any record used to prove identity, age, residential
31 address, social security number, or other personal information
32 required to apply for a driver's license or identicard.

33 (b) Information provided under RCW 46.20.111 that indicates that
34 an applicant declined to register with the selective service system.

35 (c) Any record pertaining to a vehicle license plate, driver's
36 license, or identicard issued under RCW 46.08.066 that, alone or in
37 combination with any other records, may reveal the identity of an
38 individual, or reveal that an individual is or was, performing an
39 undercover or covert law enforcement, confidential public health
40 work, public assistance fraud, or child support investigative

1 activity. This exemption does not prevent the release of the total
2 number of vehicle license plates, drivers' licenses, or identicards
3 that, under RCW 46.08.066, an agency or department has applied for,
4 been issued, denied, returned, destroyed, lost, and reported for
5 misuse.

6 (d) Any record pertaining to a vessel registration issued under
7 RCW 88.02.330 that, alone or in combination with any other records,
8 may reveal the identity of an individual, or reveal that an
9 individual is or was, performing an undercover or covert law
10 enforcement activity. This exemption does not prevent the release of
11 the total number of vessel registrations that, under RCW 88.02.330,
12 an agency or department has applied for, been issued, denied,
13 returned, destroyed, lost, and reported for misuse; (~~and~~)

14 (8) All information related to individual claims resolution
15 structured settlement agreements submitted to the board of industrial
16 insurance appeals under RCW 51.04.063, other than final orders from
17 the board of industrial insurance appeals.

18 Upon request by the legislature, the department of licensing
19 shall provide a report to the legislature containing all of the
20 information in subsection (7)(c) and (d) of this section that is
21 subject to public disclosure(~~(-)~~); and

22 (9) Voluntarily submitted information contained in a database
23 that is part of or associated with enhanced 911 emergency
24 communications systems, or information contained or used in emergency
25 notification systems as provided under RCW 38.52.575 and 38.52.577.

26 **Sec. 2.** RCW 42.56.250 and 2014 c 106 s 1 are each amended to
27 read as follows:

28 The following employment and licensing information is exempt from
29 public inspection and copying under this chapter:

30 (1) Test questions, scoring keys, and other examination data used
31 to administer a license, employment, or academic examination;

32 (2) All applications for public employment, including the names
33 of applicants, resumes, and other related materials submitted with
34 respect to an applicant;

35 (3)(a) The following information held by any public agency in
36 personnel records, public employment related records, volunteer
37 rosters, or included in any mailing list of employees or volunteers
38 of any public agency:

1 (i) Residential addresses (not including city, state, and the
2 five-digit service area zip code, although the additional four digits
3 in any enhanced zip code are exempt), residential telephone numbers,
4 personal wireless telephone numbers, personal ((electronic mail))
5 email addresses, social security numbers, driver's license numbers,
6 identocard numbers, passport and visa numbers, and emergency contact
7 information of employees or volunteers of a public agency((τ)); and
8 ((the names, dates of birth, residential addresses, residential
9 telephone numbers, personal wireless telephone numbers, personal
10 electronic mail addresses, social security numbers, and emergency
11 contact information))

12 (ii) All identifying and contact information of dependents of
13 employees or volunteers of a public agency.

14 (b) For purposes of this subsection (3), "employees" includes
15 independent provider home care workers as defined in RCW 74.39A.240;

16 (4) Information that identifies a person who, while an agency
17 employee: (a) Seeks advice, under an informal process established by
18 the employing agency, in order to ascertain his or her rights in
19 connection with a possible unfair practice under chapter 49.60 RCW
20 against the person; and (b) requests his or her identity or any
21 identifying information not be disclosed;

22 (5) Investigative records compiled by an employing agency
23 conducting an active and ongoing investigation of a possible unfair
24 practice under chapter 49.60 RCW or of a possible violation of other
25 federal, state, or local laws prohibiting discrimination in
26 employment. For purposes of this subsection, the exemption is
27 categorical and exempts the records in their entirety while the
28 investigation is ongoing. Once the agency has notified the
29 complaining employee of the outcome of the investigation, the
30 exemption no longer applies;

31 (6) Criminal history records checks for board staff finalist
32 candidates conducted pursuant to RCW 43.33A.025;

33 (7) Except as provided in RCW 47.64.220, salary and benefit
34 information for maritime employees collected from private employers
35 under RCW 47.64.220(1) and described in RCW 47.64.220(2); and

36 (8) Photographs and month and year of birth in the personnel
37 files of employees and workers of criminal justice agencies as
38 defined in RCW 10.97.030. The news media, as defined in RCW
39 5.68.010(5), shall have access to the photographs and full date of
40 birth. For the purposes of this subsection, news media does not

1 include any person or organization of persons in the custody of a
2 criminal justice agency as defined in RCW 10.97.030.

5 follows:

7 information is exempt from disclosure under this chapter:

9 code or object code, and research data obtained by any agency within
10 five years of the request for disclosure when disclosure would
11 produce private gain and public loss;

12 ~~((2))~~ (b) Financial information supplied by or on behalf of a
13 person, firm, or corporation for the purpose of qualifying to submit
14 a bid or proposal for ~~((a))~~ (i) a ferry system construction or
15 repair contract as required by RCW 47.60.680 through 47.60.750 or
16 ~~((b))~~ (ii) highway construction or improvement as required by RCW
17 47.28.070;

18 ~~((3))~~ (c) Financial and commercial information and records
19 supplied by private persons pertaining to export services provided
20 under chapters 43.163 and 53.31 RCW, and by persons pertaining to
21 export projects under RCW 43.23.035;

22 ~~((4))~~ (d) Financial and commercial information and records
23 supplied by businesses or individuals during application for loans or
24 program services provided by chapters 43.325, 43.163, 43.160, 43.330,
25 and 43.168 RCW, or during application for economic development loans
26 or program services provided by any local agency;

27 ~~((5))~~ (e) Financial information, business plans, examination
28 reports, and any information produced or obtained in evaluating or
29 examining a business and industrial development corporation organized

10 siting, recruitment, expansion, retention, or relocation of that
11 person's business, information described in ~~((a)(ii))~~ (1)(i)(B) of
12 this subsection will be available to the public under this chapter;

14 or obtained by the department of ecology or the authority created

28 trade secrets submitted by a permit holder, mine operator, or

31 districts, unless permission to release the farm plan is granted by
32 the landowner or operator who requested the plan, or the farm plan is
33 used for the application or issuance of a permit;

35 under the federal clean water act, 33 U.S.C. Sec. 1251 et seq., are
36 subject to RCW 42.56.610 and 90.64.190;

8 information relates to investments in private funds, to the extent
9 that such information, if revealed, would reasonably be expected to
10 result in loss to the University of Washington consolidated endowment
11 fund or to result in private loss to the providers of this
12 information;

14 RCW 70.95N.190(4);

16 financial institutions or to a portal under RCW 21.20.883, when filed

18 obtaining the exemption from state securities registration for small

20 on behalf of an investor for the purpose of purchasing such

27 NEW SECTION. Sec. 4. A new section is added to chapter 42.56
28 RCW to read as follows:
29 Bids, quotations, or proposals submitted to an agency for goods
30 or services in response to a solicitation issued for such goods or
31 services are exempt from disclosure until the agency announces the
32 apparent successful bidder based on predetermined criteria or decides
33 not to accept any bids, quotations, or proposals.

34 NEW SECTION. Sec. 5. RCW 39.26.030 (State procurement records—
35 Disclosure) and 2012 c 224 s 4 are each repealed.

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
