- 1 AN ACT Relating to an ethnic studies curriculum for public school
- 2 students; adding a new section to chapter 28A.300 RCW; creating new
- 3 sections; and providing an expiration date.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- NEW SECTION. 5 Sec. 1. The legislature stated in RCW 28A.150.210 6 that a "basic education is an evolving program of instruction that is intended to provide students with the opportunity to become 7 responsible and respectful global citizens." In order to prepare 8 students to be global citizens, the legislature intends to require 9 superintendent of public instruction 10 develop, 11 periodically update, a model ethnic studies curriculum for use in 12 seven through twelve. The legislature also 13 encourage public schools with students in grades seven through twelve
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 2. A new section is added to chapter 28A.300 RCW to read as follows:

to offer an ethnic studies course that incorporates this curriculum.

17 (1) By September 1, 2018, the superintendent of public 18 instruction shall develop, and periodically update, a model ethnic 19 studies curriculum for use in grades seven through twelve. The model 20 curriculum must be designed to prepare students to be global citizens

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in a global society with an appreciation for the contributions of multiple cultures. The model curriculum must be posted on the superintendent of public instruction's web site.

- (2) Public schools with students in grades seven through twelve are encouraged to offer an ethnic studies course that incorporates the curriculum developed under subsection (1) of this section.
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 3. (1)(a) To aid in the development of the ethnic studies curriculum required under section 2 of this act, the superintendent of public instruction must establish an ethnic studies advisory committee.
 - (b) The ethnic studies advisory committee must advise, assist, and make recommendations to the superintendent of public instruction regarding the development of the model ethnic studies curriculum required under section 2 of this act.
 - (c) The ethnic studies advisory committee must be composed of a majority of educators with experience in teaching ethnic studies from public high schools and institutions of higher education, including educators representing the Washington state commissions on African-American affairs, Asian Pacific American affairs, and Hispanic affairs, and the governor's office of Indian affairs.
- 21 (2) This section expires June 30, 2019.

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
