## SUBSTITUTE HOUSE BILL 2793

1 AN ACT Relating to reducing the use of certain toxic chemicals in 2 firefighting activities; adding a new chapter to Title 70 RCW; and 3 prescribing penalties.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

5 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 1. The definitions in this section apply 6 throughout this chapter unless the context clearly requires 7 otherwise.

8 (1) "Class B firefighting foam" means foams designed for9 flammable liquid fires.

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(2) "Department" means the department of ecology.

(3) "Firefighting personal protective equipment" means any clothing designed, intended, or marketed to be worn by firefighting personnel in the performance of their duties, designed with the intent for the use in fire and rescue activities, including jackets, pants, shoes, gloves, helmets, and respiratory equipment.

16 (4) "Local governments" includes any county, city, town, fire 17 district, regional fire protection authority, or other special 18 purpose district that provides firefighting services.

19 (5) "Manufacturer" includes any person, firm, association, 20 partnership, corporation, organization, joint venture, importer, or 21 domestic distributor of firefighting agents or firefighting

equipment. For the purposes of this subsection, "importer" means the
 owner of the product.

3 (6) "Perfluoroalkyl and polyfluoroalkyl substances" or "PFAS 4 chemicals" means, for the purposes of firefighting agents and 5 firefighting equipment, a class of fluorinated organic chemicals 6 containing at least one fully fluorinated carbon atom.

7 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 2.** (1) Beginning July 1, 2020, a manufacturer 8 of class B firefighting foam may not manufacture, knowingly sell, 9 offer for sale, distribute for sale, or distribute for use in this 10 state class B firefighting foam to which PFAS chemicals have been 11 intentionally added.

(2) The restrictions in subsection (1) of this section do not 12 apply to any manufacture, sale, or distribution of class B 13 firefighting foam where the inclusion of PFAS chemicals are required 14 by federal law, including but not limited to the requirements of 14 15 16 C.F.R. 139.317, as that section existed as of January 1, 2018. In the 17 event that applicable federal regulations change after January 1, 2018, to allow the use of alternative firefighting agents that do not 18 19 contain PFAS chemicals, then the department may adopt rules that 20 restrict PFAS chemicals for the manufacture, sale, and distribution of firefighting foam for uses that are addressed by the federal 21 22 regulation.

(3) Beginning July 1, 2018, a person, local government, or state
agency may not discharge or otherwise use for training purposes class
B firefighting foam that contains intentionally added PFAS chemicals.

NEW SECTION. Sec. 3. (1) Beginning July 1, 2018, a manufacturer or other person that sells firefighting personal protective equipment to any person, local government, or state agency must provide written notice to the purchaser at the time of sale if the firefighting personal protective equipment contains PFAS chemicals. The written notice must include a statement that the firefighting personal protective equipment contains PFAS chemicals.

33 (2) The manufacturer or person selling firefighting personal 34 protective equipment and the purchaser of the equipment must retain 35 the notice on file for at least three years from the date of the 36 transaction. Upon the request of the department, a person, 37 manufacturer, or purchaser must furnish the notice, or written

1 copies, and associated sales documentation to the department within 2 sixty days.

3 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 4. (1) A manufacturer of class B firefighting 4 foam restricted under section 2 of this act must notify, in writing, 5 persons that sell the manufacturer's products in this state about the 6 provisions of this chapter no less than one year prior to the 7 effective date of the restrictions.

8 (2) A manufacturer that produces, sells, or distributes a class B 9 firefighting foam prohibited under section 2 of this act shall recall 10 the product and reimburse the retailer or any other purchaser for the 11 product.

12 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 5. (1) The department may request a 13 certificate of compliance from a manufacturer of class B firefighting 14 foam or firefighting personal protective equipment. A certificate of 15 compliance attests that a manufacturer's product or products meets 16 the requirements of this chapter.

(2) Beginning July 1, 2018, the department shall assist the 17 department of enterprise services, other state agencies, fire 18 protection districts, and other local governments to avoid purchasing 19 or using class B firefighting foams to which PFAS chemicals have been 20 intentionally added, consistent with section 2 of this act. The 21 department shall assist the department of enterprise services, other 22 23 state agencies, fire protection districts, and other local governments to give priority and preference to the purchase of 24 firefighting personal protective equipment that does not contain PFAS 25 26 chemicals.

27 Sec. 6. A manufacturer of class B firefighting NEW SECTION. 28 foam in violation of section 2 or 4 of this act, a person or local 29 government in violation of section 2(3) of this act, or a person in violation of section 3 of this act, is subject to a civil penalty not 30 to exceed five thousand dollars for each violation in the case of a 31 first offense. Manufacturers, local governments, or persons that are 32 33 repeat violators are subject to a civil penalty not to exceed ten thousand dollars for each repeat offense. Penalties collected under 34 this section must be deposited in the state toxics control account 35 36 created in RCW 70.105D.070.
