- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 6 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 1.** A new section is added to chapter 43.101 7 RCW to read as follows:
- 8 Subject to the availability of amounts appropriated for this 9 specific purpose, the commission shall:
- 10 (1) Review, update, and provide basic and in-service training for 11 peace officers and corrections officers that:
- 12 (a) Emphasizes de-escalation in patrol tactics and interpersonal communication training; and
 - (b) Includes "shoot/don't shoot" scenario training;
- 15 (2) Incorporate a training component that requires cadets to meet 16 with local minority advisory boards in each jurisdiction;
- 17 (3) Pairs cadets with seasoned veteran officers to patrol 18 minority communities in order to observe a working positive example 19 of how that officer interacts with members of the community in the 20 course of his or her duties.

NEW SECTION. **Sec. 2.** A new section is added to chapter 36.28A RCW to read as follows:

Subject to the availability of amounts appropriated for this specific purpose, the Washington association of sheriffs and police chiefs shall establish minority advisory boards comprised of communities of color in each jurisdiction whose officers are trained by the criminal justice training commission.
