SUBSTITUTE SENATE BILL 6036

- 1 AN ACT Relating to the creation of a work group to study and make 2 recommendations on natural disaster mitigation and resiliency
- 3 activities; and adding new sections to chapter 48.02 RCW.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 5 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 1.** A new section is added to chapter 48.02 6 RCW to read as follows:
- 7 Residents of this state have been impacted by natural disasters such as floods, landslides, wildfires, and earthquakes and continue 8 9 to be at risk from these and other natural disasters. In 10 insured losses from natural disasters in the United States totaled 11 almost twenty-four billion dollars. In 2015, this state's wildfire 12 season was the largest in Washington state history, burning more than 13 one million acres and costing more than two hundred fifty-three 14 million dollars. In 2016, almost two hundred ninety-four thousand acres burned in Washington state and there were more than four 15 16 hundred thirty national flood insurance program (nfip) claims filed, 17 totaling over seven million dollars. It is critical that more be done to better prepare this state for disasters and to put in place 18 strategies to mitigate the impacts of the disasters. To address this 19 critical need, the legislature is creating a work group that will 20 21 review disaster mitigation and preparation projects in other states

- 2 for how this state's efforts to mitigate the impacts of natural
- 3 disasters can be expanded and coordinated and whether or not an
- 4 ongoing disaster resiliency program should be created.
- 5 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 2.** A new section is added to chapter 48.02 6 RCW to read as follows:
- 7 A working group to study and make recommendations on natural
- 8 disaster and resiliency activities is hereby created. The working
- 9 group membership shall be composed of:
- 10 (1) The insurance commissioner or his or her designee, who shall 11 be the chair of the working group;
- 12 (2) One member from each of the four major caucuses of the
- 13 legislature. The president of the senate shall appoint one member
- 14 from each of the two largest caucuses of the senate. The speaker of
- 15 the house of representatives shall appoint one member from each of
- 16 the two largest caucuses of the house of representatives. Legislative
- 17 members of the working group are reimbursed for travel expenses in
- 18 accordance with RCW 44.04.120;

- 19 (3) A representative from the governor's resilient Washington 20 work group;
- 21 (4) A representative from the Washington state association of 22 counties;
 - (5) A representative from the association of Washington cities;
 - (6) A representative from the state building code council;
- 25 (7) The supervisor of the department of natural resources or his 26 or her designee;
- 27 (8) The director of the Washington state military department or 28 his or her designee;
- 29 (9) Two representatives from the property and casualty insurance 30 industry to be selected by the office of the insurance commissioner;
- 31 (10) The director of the department of ecology or his or her 32 designee;
- 33 (11) The superintendent of public instruction or his or her 34 designee;
- 35 (12) A representative from the Washington association of building 36 officials; and
- 37 (13) The director of the department of commerce or his or her 38 designee.

NEW SECTION. Sec. 3. A new section is added to chapter 48.02 RCW to read as follows:

- (1) The working group will engage in the following activities:
- (a) Review disaster mitigation and resiliency activities being done in this state by public and private entities;
- 6 (b) Review disaster mitigation and resiliency activities being 7 done in other states and at the federal level including how other 8 states fund their risk mitigation activities and programs;
- 9 (c) Review information on uptake in this state for disaster-10 related insurance, such as flood and earthquake;
- 11 (d) Review information on how other states are coordinating 12 disaster mitigation and resiliency work and the work of entities such 13 as the California earthquake authority;
- 14 (e) Make recommendations to the legislature and the office of the insurance commissioner on:
- 16 (i) Whether this state should create an ongoing disaster 17 resiliency program;
 - (ii) What activities the program should engage in;
- 19 (iii) How the program should coordinate with state agencies and 20 other entities engaged in disaster mitigation and resiliency work;
 - (iv) Where the program should be housed; and
- (v) How the program should be funded;

- 23 (f) Invite at their discretion other agencies and stakeholders to 24 participate in specific topics or subcommittees.
- 25 (2) The working group shall meet during the 2018 interim and make 26 their recommendations to the legislature by December 1, 2018.
